The FY 2017 CoC Priority Listing includes the following:

1. Adirondack Vets House, Inc

a. Veterans Housing Program

Project Description: Adirondack Vets House requests funds to develop a permanent housing (joint TH-PH-RRH) program that will focus on providing housing and support services for homeless Veterans who do not qualify for VA services. The project will assist nine individuals in scattered site apartments.

2. Transitional Services Association, Inc.

a. TSA Housing First

Project Description: The Transitional Services Association, Inc. (TSA) requests funds to support a permanent housing program to provide tenant-based rental assistance to 32 homeless households with disabilities in Saratoga County. These disabilities include mental illness, chronic substance abuse problems, and/or HIV/AIDS. In addition to receiving rental assistance, RAP participants are assisted in accessing supportive services within the community. The proposed project will operate under the Housing First Model.

3. Corporation for AIDS Research, Education and Services, Inc.

a. Saratoga North County Planning Project (2017)

Project Description: Corporation for AIDS Research, Education and Services, Inc. (CARES) requests funds to support the operations of the CoC. Proposed funds will support coordination and facilitation of the CoC's processes; including strengthening the current CoC system, assisting with the development and implementation of a coordinated assessment system, conducting project evaluation and monitoring, conducting an annual Housing Inventory and Point-in-Time Count, participating in the Consolidated Plan, and preparing and submitting the CoC's application to HUD.

1. Domestic Violence and Rape Crisis Services of Saratoga County dba Wellspring

a. NewView Rapid Rehousing 2017-8

Grant PIN: NY0187

Project Description: Wellspring requests continued funding to support a Rapid Rehousing (RRH) program in Saratoga County. This project provides housing and supportive services to individuals and families who are homeless due to domestic violence and who have a disability of mental illness, chemical dependency, or HIV/AIDS and are actively engaged in treatment. The project assists twelve households (in four one-bedroom, four three-bedroom, and four two-bedroom units) in scattered site apartments, to attain and maintain stable housing and to increase self-sufficiency so they may exit the program to violence-free, sustainable living.

- b. *NewView Permanent Supportive 2017-18*
Grant PIN: NY0184

Project Description: Wellspring requests continued funding to support a Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) program in Saratoga County. This project provides housing and supportive services to individuals and families who are homeless due to domestic violence and who have a disability of mental illness, chemical dependency, or HIV/AIDS and are actively engaged in treatment. The project assists three households (in one three-bedroom unit and two one-bedroom units) in scattered site apartments, as well as provides three housing rental units in the community (one one-bedroom and two two-bedroom units). The project helps individuals to attain and maintain stable housing and to support treatment compliance so they may achieve their highest level of self-sufficiency.

2. Saratoga County Rural Preservation Company

- a. *VCHC Veterans Apartment House*
Grant PIN: NY0188

Project Description: Saratoga County Rural Preservation Company requests continued funding to support a Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) program in Saratoga County. This project is designed to house homeless, disabled veterans and their families in permanent housing for a period of time leading to their ability to purchase a home of their own through an established savings program. The families are housed in a two-family home located in Ballston Spa, NY.

- b. *SVAP 2017*
Grant PIN: NY1038

Project Description: Saratoga County Rural Preservation Company requests continued funding to support a Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) program in Saratoga County. This project supports fourteen units of permanent supportive housing including four studio apartments, seven one bedroom apartments, and three two bedroom apartments. All fourteen units of permanent housing are dedicated to chronically homeless veterans with little or no income. The program adheres to the Housing First Model.

Project Description: Corporation for AIDS Research, Education and Services, Inc. (CARES) requests continued funding to support a HMIS program for CoC NY-523. This is a data collection program which holds client level data. Participation in the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) is a requirement for all recipients of CoC and Emergency Solutions Grant funds.

4. Adirondack Vets House, Inc.

Project Description: Adirondack Vet House requests continued funding to support a Transitional Housing (TH) program in Northern Saratoga, Warren and Washington Counties. The program assists veterans in all areas of their lives in order to help them make a transition into permanent housing while reducing or eliminating the barriers that have created homelessness.

Project Description: Adirondack Vet House requests continued funding to support a Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) program in Northern Saratoga, Warren and Washington Counties. This permanent housing project helps house five homeless veterans, two of whom are chronically homeless.

5. WAIT House

a. Transitional Living Program for Homeless Pregnant and Parenting Youth

Project Description: WAIT House requests continued funding to support a Transitional Housing (TH) program in Saratoga, Warren and Washington Counties. This Transitional Living Program (TLP) project for Homeless Pregnant and Parenting Youth serves homeless youth ages sixteen to 21. The TLP is certified by the NYS Office of Children and Family Services to house up to five mothers and five infants for up to twelve months. The project provides case management, supportive services, and linkages to services to assist the residents in attaining a stable independent living situation in permanent housing and to be able to make healthy choices for themselves and their child. The project is located in Glens Falls, NY and serves youth from Warren, Washington and Saratoga Counties.

6. Warren Washington Association for Mental Health

a. WWAMH Housing First Program

Grant PIN: NY0716

Project Description: Warrant Washington Association for Mental Health (WWAMH) requests continued funding to support a Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) program in Hudson Falls, NY. This project supports a total of eighteen-unit apartment buildings providing permanent housing to homeless and chronically homeless adults with mental illness and/or co-occurring substance and alcohol abuse disorders. The project is staffed

24 hours a day and provides supportive services, case management, advocacy and linkages to treatment and community programs for residents. The project's goal is to improve residential stability and increase life skills abilities and self-determination.

7. **Glens Falls Housing Authority**

- a. *Community-Chronic 2017*
Grant PIN: NY0715

Project Description: Glens Falls Housing Authority requests continued funding to support a Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) program in Warren and Washington Counties, NY. This tenant-based Shelter Plus Care program for chronically homeless persons with disabilities provides rental subsidies for chronically homeless individuals and families disabled by mental illness and/or chronic substance abuse. This program serves 5 households, and 19 individuals. These individuals access community services such as mental health treatment, substance abuse treatment, and employment assistance.

Project Description: Glens Falls Housing Authority requests continued funding to support a Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) program in Hudson Falls, NY.
