

# ORANGE COUNTY QUARTERLY HMIS REPORT

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**01/01/14 - 03/31/14**

This is a transitional quarterly report for the CARES Regional HMIS. It was developed to assist communities prepare for the upcoming changes in data standards while also incorporating newly requested data elements into the report. The new data standards go into effect 1/10/14. The standards and other HUD information can be found at <https://www.onecpd.info>.

The current report has been broken into two sections: **Housing** and **Supportive Services Only**. Both sections contain breakdowns by HUD project type. Unlike past years, these reports will no longer be a cumulative spreadsheet; the amount of information and the way it now needs to be broken down no longer support that format.

Both the Housing and Supportive Services reports were modeled after the current AHAR format to help align with HUD standards and provide a better basis for community planning and comparison with the published AHAR both at the local and Federal level.

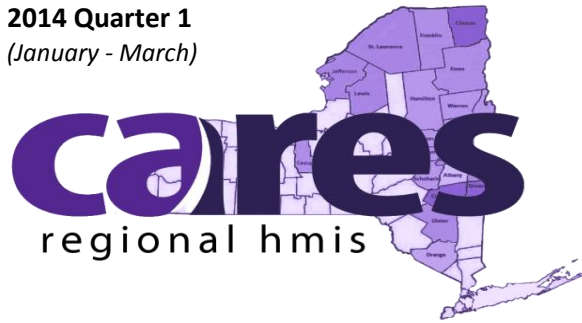
This report includes homeless prevention and housing projects participating in the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) for your community but does not include domestic violence providers, as per Federal Law, and may not include homeless programs by non-mandated providers who have chosen not to participate in the HMIS database. Within this report you will find a list of programs included in the report for your community.

This quarterly format will be in place until at least October 1, when the new data standards take effect. At that time, the reporting year for HMIS will change to align with the Federal Fiscal year and the AHAR will act as the annual report for the community with a supplementary housing report.

One of the primary changes to the reporting format is the inability to trend quarter to quarter on one report; instead we will be comparing full reports against each other for data analysis and planning. ### 2) Earned Income

HUD requires agencies to report on the percentage of change in income for all adults by stayers and leavers in the CoC annual report. This has become an important measure for the Continuum of Care.
