This is the quarterly report for the CARES Regional Homeless Management Information System (CRHMIS). The CRHMIS now reports following the Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) rather than the calendar year, meaning there are 3 reports in the 2014 calendar year. New HMIS data standards went into effect 10/1/14 and are reflected in this data.

The HMIS is a community-run, federally mandated database which collects data on the characteristics of homeless and at risk persons in a community in order to inform services and system planning efforts. This data is also reported, in unduplicated, de-identified, aggregate form to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to inform policy and regulations and make recommendations to Congress for spending.

The report is broken into two sections: **Housing** and **Supportive Services Only**. Both sections contain breakdowns by HUD project type. Unlike past years, these reports will no longer be a cumulative spreadsheet; the amount of information and the way it now needs to be broken down no longer support that format. As more Federal Partners join the HMIS initiative, further changes will be made to this report to break out that data in a meaningful way.

Both the Housing and Supportive Services reports were modeled after the current Annual Homeless Assessment Report (AHAR), sent to HUD each year, to help align with HUD standards and provide a better basis for community planning and comparison with the published AHAR both at the local and Federal level.

This report includes homeless prevention and housing projects participating in the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) for your community but does not include domestic violence providers, as per Federal Law, and may not include homeless programs by non-mandated providers who have chosen not to participate in the HMIS database. Within this report you will find a list of programs included in the report for your community.

ANNOTATIONS

1) Sum of nights in this type of housing:

This is the total sum of nights for consumers in this program type, not limited to reporting period.

2) Age

This is the age of consumers taken at the end of the reporting period

2) Earned Income

HUD requires agencies to report on the percentage of change in income for all adults by stayers and leavers in the CoC annual report. This has become an important measure for the Continuum of Care.
