**New Projects**

**1. Chances and Changes, Inc.**

*a. PSH Permanent Housing FY2017*

**Project Description:** Chances and Changes requests funds to develop a Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) program for survivors of DV in Livingston County, NY. This is a new housing project consisting of 7 units (16 beds) in scattered sites that meet identified housing gaps. This program will utilize a Housing First approach.

**2. CARES, Inc. (Corporation for AIDS Research, Education and Services, Inc.)**

*a. Elmira/501 CoC Planning Project (2017)*

**Project Description:** CARES requests funds to support the operations of the CoC. Proposed funds will support coordination and facilitation of the CoC's processes; including strengthening the current CoC system, assisting with the development and implementation of a coordinated assessment system, project evaluation and monitoring, conducting an annual Housing Inventory and Point-in-Time Count, participating in the Consolidated Plan, and preparing and submitting the CoC's application to HUD.

**Renewal Projects**

**1. Steuben Churchpeople Against Poverty, Inc.**

*a. Livingston Supportive Housing (FY 2017)*

**Grant PIN: NY0829**

**Project Description:** Steuben Churchpeople Against Poverty is requesting continued funding for their Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) program in Steuben County. The program serves 1 family and 6 singles. Mental illness is often either a primary cause or a contributing factor to homelessness. Once safe, stable housing is established for an individual with a mental illness (the recommended first step), support in entering or re-entering treatment, and dedicated case management from trained staff are essential services to help and individual maintain health and thus retain housing. This project prioritizes beds for those that meet the Chronically Homeless definition, serving those with the most severe needs first.

*b. Transitional to Permanent Supportive Housing (FY 2017)*

**Grant PIN: NY0025**

**Project Description:** Steuben Churchpeople Against Poverty is requesting continued funding for their Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) project to serve survivors of domestic violence in Steuben County, NY. The renewal project serves women and children who exit the domestic violence emergency shelter in Steuben County and offers rental assistance and case management.

- c. *Steuben County S+C (FY 2017)*  
**Grant PIN: NY0021**

**Project Description:** Steuben Churchpeople Against Poverty is requesting continued funding for their Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) program in Steuben County, NY. This project renews funding for 19 household units and 31 single units of rental assistance (from HUD funds) and supports (from leveraged funds) to homeless persons with disabilities, specifically those with a severe and persistent mental illness. Project services help clients to locate, secure, and stay in safe and affordable housing, and to learn the skills to remain in permanent housing of their choice. Support services, to help with housing, employment, education, living skills, or other needs are either provided directly or secured through referral to community agencies, and these linkages become a key housing permanency strategy.

**2. Allegany County Community Opportunities & Rural Development (ACCORD Corporation)**

- a. *FY2017 RRH Supportive Housing Project I*  
**Grant PIN: NY1061**

**Project Description:** ACCORD is requesting continued funding to serve chronically homeless households throughout the CoC. Funds requested will serve 7 household units and 8 single units by providing security deposits and rental housing subsidies to enable these households to secure and maintain decent, safe, affordable housing as they work towards their goals of economic stability and self-sufficiency.

- b. *FY2017 RRH Supportive Housing Project II*  
**Grant PIN: NY1062**

**Project Description:** ACCORD is requesting continued funding to serve chronically homeless households throughout the CoC. Funds requested will serve 8 household by providing security deposits and rental housing subsidies to enable these households to secure and maintain decent, safe, affordable housing as they work towards their goals of economic stability and self-sufficiency.

**3. Chances and Changes, Inc.**

- a. *SHP Permanent Housing Livingston FY2017*  
**Grant PIN: NY0831**

**Project Description:** Chances and Changes, Inc. is requesting continued funding for their Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) program dedicated to serve survivors of domestic violence in Livingston County, NY. This renewal is for 9 units of SHP Permanent Housing scattered site project that meets identified housing gaps in the county. The funds are to be utilized for leasing assistance and support services which includes case management.

**4. Catholic Charities of Chemung/Schuyler**

- a. *BONUS-Permanent Supported Housing*  
**Grant PIN: NY0830**

**Project Description:** Catholic Charities of Chemung/Schuyler requests continued funding for their Permanent Housing (PH) program. This renewal application is for a 9-unit PH-PSH scattered site project that meets an identified housing gap in Chemung and Schuyler counties. Funds are for leasing assistance, case management and limited operational costs.

- b. *HMIS*  
**Grant PIN: NY0019**

**Project Description:** Catholic Charities of Chemung/Schuyler requests continued funding for their HMIS program. This is a data collection program which holds HUD required client level data. Participation in the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) is a requirement for all recipients of CoC and Emergency Solutions Grant funds.

- c. *HSH – Permanent Supported Housing*  
**Grant PIN: NY0564**

**Project Description:** Catholic Charities of Chemung/Schuyler requests continued funding for their Permanent Housing (PH) program in Chemung/Schuyler Counties. This renewal application is for an 18-unit PH-PSH scattered site project that meets an identified housing gap. Funds are for leasing assistance and supportive services.

- d. *SHP – Permanent Supported Housing*  
**Grant PIN: NY0766**

**Project Description:** Catholic Charities of Chemung/Schuyler requests continued funding for their Permanent Housing (PH) program. Funds support scattered site permanent housing for individuals and families who are homeless and live in Schuyler County. At full capacity, the program will include 3 units with 7 beds.

- e. *HSHE – Permanent Supported Housing*  
**Grant PIN: NY0659**

**Project Description:** Catholic Charities of Chemung/Schuyler requests continued funding for their Permanent Housing (PH) program. This renewal application is for a 4-unit PH-PSH scattered site project that meets an identified housing gap. Funds are for leasing assistance, support services and limited operational costs.

- f. *Schuyler SHARE – RR Hsg*  
**Grant PIN: NY1064**

**Project Description:** Catholic Charities of Chemung and Schuyler Counties (CCCS), is requesting Rapid Rehousing funds to support 4 households (8 beds) in a medium-term, tenant-based rental assistance project (3 to 12 months). The project meets an identified housing gap for homeless individuals, particularly young adults under 24 years of age, and homeless families, who are coming from the street or living in the LDSS subsidized motel or fleeing domestic violence. Funds will provide rental and deposit assistance, HMIS, case management and administration.

- g. *Chemung SHARE – RR Hsg*  
**Grant PIN: NY1063**

**Project Description:** Catholic Charities of Chemung and Schuyler Counties (CCCS), is requesting Rapid Rehousing funds to support 7 households (14 beds) in a medium-term, tenant-based rental assistance project (3 to 12 months). The project meets an identified housing gap for homeless individuals, particularly young adults under 24 years of age, and homeless families, who are coming from the street or living in the CCCS shelter or fleeing domestic violence. Funds will provide rental and deposit assistance, case management and administration.

- h. *S+C Permanent Supported Housing*  
**Grant PIN: NY0022**

**Project Description:** Catholic Charities of Chemung/Schuyler requests continued funding for their Permanent Housing (PH) program. The project is a 25-unit PH-PSH scattered site project that meets an identified housing gap. Funds are for rental assistance only and addresses both HUD's and the CoC's strategic goals. The selection criteria will not require housing readiness, rental or criminal history checks, income, nor require applicants be sober, treatment compliant or participate in services prior to admission. An admission case manager assists participants in locating housing of their choice. An inspection is conducted to ensure safe, affordable housing close to amenities. Case managers develop service plans and provide assistance with linkages to support services.
