



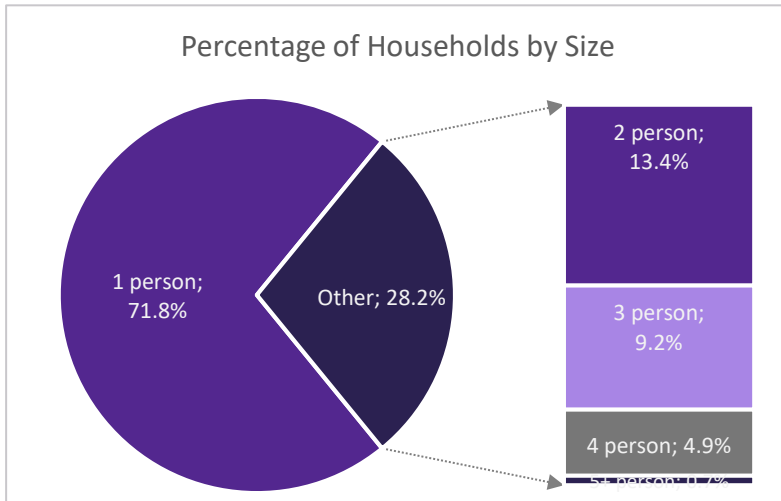

7/1/2017-9/30/2017

Overview – All Programs

Between 7/1/2017 and 9/30/2017, providers in the Franklin County CoC served 212 people experiencing or at risk of experiencing homelessnessⁱ. Residential programs served these 212 peopleⁱⁱ.

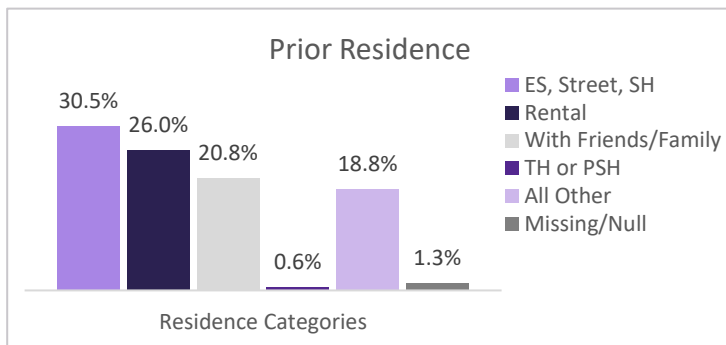


There were 142 households in the CoC, including: 105 households without children (containing 110 individuals), 37 households with both adults and children (containing 44 adults and 58 children), and no households of only unaccompanied minorsⁱⁱⁱ.

By gender, providers in the CoC served 118 (55.7%) women, 92 (43.4%) men, and 2 (0.9%) trans-identified individuals.

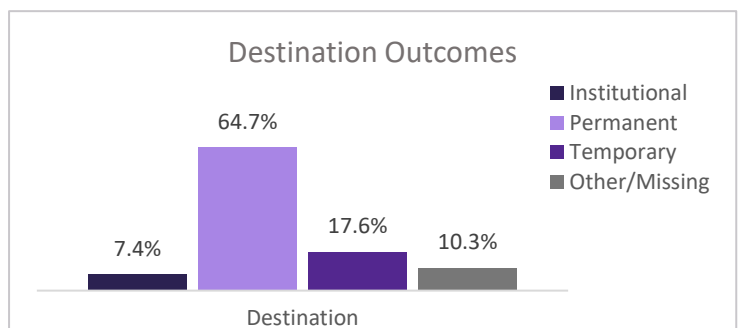
The racial and ethnic breakdown of those served included: 195 (92.0%) White, 1 (0.5%)

Black or African-American, 1 (0.5%) Asian, 7 (3.3%) American Indian or Alaskan Native, and 6 (2.8%) Multiple Races. 9 (4.2%) individuals identified as Hispanic/Latino regardless of race.



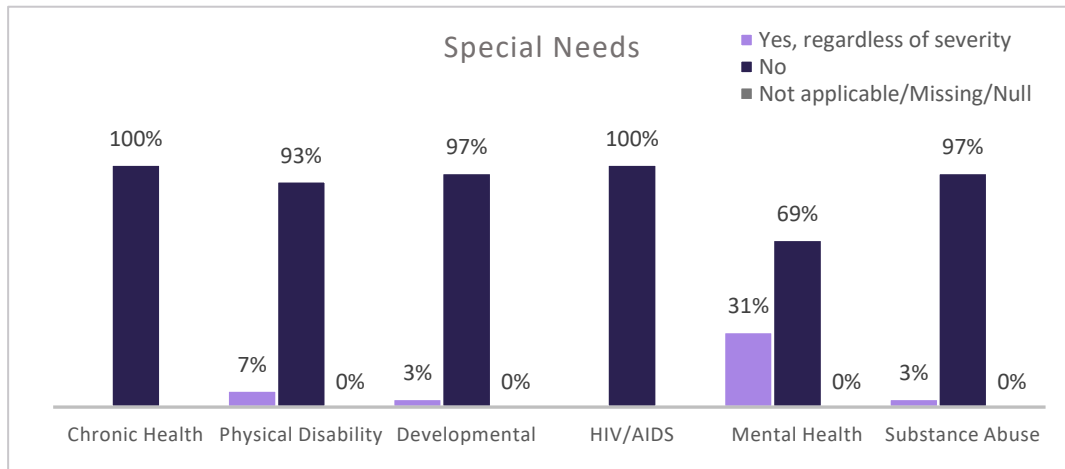
Of 154 adults or heads of household, 47 (30.5%) indicated a prior residence of Emergency Shelter, the streets, or Safe Haven. Of these clients, 33 (70.2%) reported no previous episodes of homelessness within the last three years. 7 (14.9%), 2 (4.3%), and 3 (6.4%) reported that they had been 2, 3, or 4+ times homeless (respectively) during the same time frame. 3 (6.4%) did not report on this data element.

For the adults or heads of household who were in program a year or more and received an annual assessment (36), 12 (33.3%) saw an increase in income (cash and cash benefits) between admission and the most recent update, while 13 (36.1%) saw no change in income that was initially higher than zero^{iv}.



The total number of individuals discharged during the quarter was 68, which included 55 adults and 13 children. 44 (64.7%) were discharged to a permanent destination. Of the clients over 18, income for 4 (7.3%) rose between admission and discharge, while 48 (87.3%) maintained stable income of greater than zero.

Special Needs – HUD and HHS Funded Programs Only



56.3% of adults (9/16) and 23.1% of children (3/13) in HUD or HHS funded programs self-reported at least one physical, emotional, or other health condition *regardless of whether the condition had become serious enough to be disabling*. Among those reporting multiple conditions,

the most significant comorbidity was Mental Health and Substance Use (1). When taking severity of condition into account, 4 adults reported conditions that met the criteria to be considered a disability.

Sub-Populations – HUD HHS

1 (0.6%) individuals over 18 met the criteria for chronic homelessness at the time of project entry.^v 1 out of every 30.8 adults receiving services this quarter was a veteran (3.2%). Out of the 5 veterans served, 3 (60.0%) reported a disabling condition and () met the criteria for chronic homelessness at admission.
