

## **Before Starting the Project Listings for the CoC Priority Listing**

**The FY 2018 CoC Consolidated Application requires TWO submissions. Both this Project Priority Listing AND the CoC Application MUST be submitted prior to the CoC Program Competition deadline as required by the FY 2018 CoC Program Competition NOFA.**

The FY 2018 CoC Priority Listing includes the following:

- Reallocation forms – must be fully completed if the CoC is reallocating eligible renewal projects to create new projects as described in the FY 2018 CoC Program Competition NOFA.
- New Project Listing – lists all new project applications created through reallocation, the bonus, and DV Bonus that have been approved and ranked or rejected by the CoC.
- Renewal Project Listing – lists all eligible renewal project applications that have been approved and ranked or rejected by the CoC.
- UFA Costs Project Listing – applicable and only visible for Collaborative Applicants that were designated as a Unified Funding Agency (UFA) during the FY 2018 CoC Program Registration process. Things to Remember:

CATHOLIC CHARITIES OF CHEMUNG/SCHUYLER (CCCS)

### **1. Bonus Youth RRH**

**Project Description:** The Catholic Charities of Chemung/Schuyler requests funds to develop a youth RRH program to service individuals of age 18-24 in Chemung and Schuyler Counties. This is a new housing project consisting of 9 units (13 beds). This program will utilize a Housing First approach.

Proposed funds will support coordination and facilitation of the CoC's processes; including strengthening the current CoC system, assisting with the development and implementation of a coordinated assessment system, project evaluation and monitoring, conducting an annual Housing Inventory and Point-in-Time Count, participating in the Consolidated Plan, and preparing and submitting the CoC's application to HUD.

### **4. Arbor Dev – PSH Livingston (2018)**

Grant PIN: NY0829

**Project Description:** Steuben Church People Against Poverty is requesting continued funding for their PSH program in Steuben County. The program serves 1 family and 6 singles. Mental illness is often either a primary cause or a contributing factor to homelessness. Once safe, stable housing is established for an individual with a mental illness (the recommended first step), support in entering or re-entering treatment, and dedicated case management from trained staff are essential services to help and individual maintain health and thus retain housing. This project prioritizes beds for those that meet the Chronically Homeless definition, serving those with the most severe needs first.

**5. Arbor Dev – TH to PSH (2018)**

**Project Description:** Steuben Church People Against Poverty is requesting continued funding for their PSH project to serve survivors of domestic violence in Steuben County, NY. The renewal project serves women and children who exit the domestic violence emergency shelter in Steuben County and offers rental assistance and case management.

**6. Arbor Dev – S Plus C Steuben (2018)**

**Project Description:** Steuben Church People Against Poverty is requesting continued funding for their PSH program in Steuben County, NY. The primary goal of the program is to immediately address homelessness for individuals and families in these DV situations. This program will utilize a Housing First approach.
