**Subject:** Housing Inventory and Point in Time Count Summary

This memorandum summarizes highlights from the 2019 Housing Inventory Chart (HIC) and Point in Time Count (PIT). The HIC-PIT will be submitted on behalf on or before April 29, 2019 in accordance to HUD's requirement.

# **2019 Housing Inventory Summary**

Continuums are required to report annually on the number of available beds dedicated to homeless persons; these beds include emergency, transitional and permanent housing. Below is a summary of changes within these beds from 2018 to 2019.

- Emergency Year-Round Bed: There was no change from 2017 to 2018, (17) beds.
- Emergency Overflow Beds: The overflow bed count increased from 24 to 27.
  - o These were voucher beds from DSS.
- Transitional Beds: The transitional bed count went up by 1 from 62 in 2018 to 63 in 2019.
- Permanent Housing Beds:
  - Permanent Supportive Housing: The PSH bed count increased by 140 beds from 336 to 476
    - This increase is due to having the VA VASH beds include this year (62 beds), they were not included last year.
    - DSS Shelter Plus Chronic 1 increased by 11 beds.
    - DSS Transitional increased by 55 beds.
    - Neighbors of Watertown Burdick Building increased by 3 beds.
    - Neighbors of Watertown Emmerson Place increased by 2 beds.
    - o Neighbors of Watertown Kieff Drive increased 6 beds.
- Rapid Rehousing: The RR beds decreased by 13 beds from 184 in 2018 to 171 in 2019.
  - Massena Independent Living Center Rapid Rehousing increased from 46 beds in 2018 to 82 beds in 2019.
  - North Country Transitional Living Services Rapid Rehousing increased from 8 beds in 2018 to 27 beds in 2019.
  - Snow Belt Housing ESG Rapid Rehousing decreased from 27 beds in 2018 to 1 bed in 2019.
  - o Snow Belt Housing CoC Rapid Rehousing increased from 0 beds in 2018 to 10 beds in 2019.
  - Watertown Urban Mission Rapid Rehousing decreased from 103 beds in 2018 to 51 beds in 2019.
- Dedicated Chronic Beds: The chronic homeless beds remained the same at 28.

#### Sheltered PIT Breakdown

- When comparing the 2019 (78 persons) sheltered PIT with the 2018 (90 persons) sheltered PIT a decrease in the total number of persons sheltered is noted.
- In total, there was a decrease of 14 persons utilizing emergency/transitional housing services on the night
  of the count with a 5 person decrease in utilizing emergency services, and a 7 person decrease in
  utilization of transitional housing services.

## **Sheltered PIT Subpopulation Information**

- There was no change in chronically homeless individuals reported in this year's sheltered count. 2018 counted 0, 2019 counted 0.
- Adults with a Serious Mental Illness: The number of sheltered persons with serious mental illness decreased from 23 persons in 2018 to 7 persons in 2019.
- Adults with a Substance Use Disorder: The number of sheltered persons with substance abuse disorder decreased from 17 persons in 2018 to 2 persons in 2019.
- Adults with HIV/AIDS: The number of sheltered persons with HIV/AIDS has remained zero.
- Victims of Domestic Violence: The number of sheltered persons noting DV decreased 8 persons in 2018 to 6 persons in 2019.
- Chronically Homeless Vets: The number of chronically homeless sheltered Vets remained the same at 0.
- Chronically Homeless Unaccompanied Youth: The number of chronically homeless unaccompanied youth increased from 4 in 2018 to 7 in 2019.
- Parenting youth decreased from 4 persons in 2018 to 0 in 2019.

# **Unsheltered PIT breakdown**

- When comparing the 2019 unsheltered PIT with the 2018 unsheltered PIT a 2-person decrease was noted.
- In 2019 there were 4 unsheltered individuals identified compared to 6 unsheltered individuals counted in 2018.

## **Unsheltered PIT Subpopulation Information**

- There was a decrease of chronic homeless unsheltered persons. In 2018, 2 persons were reported compared to 0 persons in 2019.
- Adults with a Serious Mental Illness: The number of unsheltered persons with serious mental illness decreased from 4 in 2018 to 2 in 2019.
- Adults with a Substance Use Disorder: The number of unsheltered persons with substance use disorder remained the same at 1 in 2018 and 2019.
- Adults with HIV/AIDS: The number of unsheltered persons with HIV/AIDS remained the same at 0 persons.
- *Victims of Domestic Violence:* The number of unsheltered persons noting DV remained the same at 0 persons.
- Chronically Homeless Vets: The number of chronically homeless unsheltered Vets remained the same at 0.
- Chronically Homeless Unaccompanied Youth: The number of chronically homeless unaccompanied youth decreased from 3 in 2018 to 0 in 2019.
- Parenting youth remained the same at zero.
