Subject: Housing Inventory and Point in Time Summary

This memorandum summarizes highlights from the 2019 Housing Inventory Chart (HIC) and Point in Time Survey (PIT). The HIC-PIT will be submitted on the CoC's behalf on or before April 29, 2019 in accordance to HUD's requirement.

2018 Housing Inventory Chart Summary

Continuums are required to report annually on the number of available beds dedicated to homeless persons; these beds include emergency, transitional and permanent housing. Below is a summary of changes within these beds from 2018 to 2019.

- **Emergency Year-Round Beds:** The year-round bed count increased from 38 in 2018 to 42 in 2019.
- **Emergency Seasonal Beds:** The seasonal bed count increased from 54 beds in 2018 to 57 beds in 2019.
- **Emergency Overflow Beds:** Emergency Overflow beds decreased from 5 beds in 2018 to 4 beds in 2019.
- **Transitional Beds:** The year-round bed count remained the same at 50.
- **Permanent Housing Beds:**
 - **Permanent Supportive Housing:** The PSH bed count increased by 4 beds from 73 in 2018 to 77 in 2019.
 - **Rapid Rehousing:** The RRH bed count increased from 8 in 2018 to 37 in 2019.
 - An increase of 3 rapid rehousing programs newly added to the HIC contributed to the increase in bed count.
 - **Chronic Beds:** The number of dedicated chronic beds increased to 26.
 - This increase is due to the addition of Rockland County Department of Social Service's PSH program.

Sheltered PIT Breakdown

- *When comparing the 2019 sheltered PIT (139 people) with the 2018 PIT (130 people) an increase in the total number of persons sheltered is noted.*
- *In total there was an increase of 9 persons utilizing homeless services on the night of the count. There was an 8 person increase utilizing emergency shelters and a 1 person increase utilizing transitional housing.*
- *Homeless Individuals: The number of homeless individuals increased from 95 in 2018 to 102 in 2019.*
- *Homeless Families: The number households of homeless families decreased from 13 (35 persons) in 2018 to 12 (37 persons) in 2019.*
- *Unaccompanied Homeless Youth: The number households of unaccompanied homeless youth remained the same in 2019 at 3.*
- *Parenting Homeless Youth: The number households of homeless parenting homeless youth remained the same in 2019 at 3 (8 persons also remained the same).*
- *Homeless Vets: The number households of homeless veterans remained the same in 2019 at 3.*

Sheltered PIT Subpopulation Information

- *Chronically Homeless Individuals: The number of chronically homeless individuals increased from 4 in 2018 to 10 in 2019.*
- *Chronically Homeless Families: The number of chronically homeless families remained the same in 2019 at 0.*
- *Chronically Homeless Vets: The number of chronically homeless sheltered veterans decreased from 1 in 2018 to 0 in 2019.*
- *Adults with a Serious Mental Illness: The number of sheltered persons with serious mental illness increased from 0 in 2018 to 18 in 2019.*
- *Adults with a Substance Use Disorder: The number of sheltered persons with substance use disorder increased from 0 in 2018 to 25 in 2019.*
- *Adults with HIV/AIDS: The number of sheltered persons with HIV/AIDS increased from 0 in 2018 to 1 in 2019.*
- *Victims of Domestic Violence: The number of sheltered persons noting DV decreased from 7 in 2018 to 6 in 2019.*

Unsheltered PIT Breakdown

- *When comparing the 2018 unsheltered PIT with 2017 PIT, the unsheltered count decreased by 7 persons.*

Unsheltered PIT Subpopulation Information

- *Chronically Homeless Individuals: The number of unsheltered chronically homeless individuals increased from 21 in 2018 to 26 in 2019.*
- *Chronically Homeless Families: The number of unsheltered chronically homeless families remained at 0.*
- *Chronically Homeless Vets: The number of chronically homeless unsheltered veterans decreased from 1 in 2018 to 0 in 2019.*
- *Adults with a Serious Mental Illness: The number of unsheltered adults with a serious mental illness decreased from 12 persons in 2018 to 4 in 2019.*
- *Adults with a Substance Use Disorder: The number of unsheltered persons with substance abuse disorder decreased from 18 persons in 2018 to 8 in 2019.*
- *Adults with HIV/AIDS: The number of unsheltered persons with HIV/AIDS remained the same at 0.*
- *Victims of Domestic Violence: The number of unsheltered persons noting DV remained the same at 0.*
