



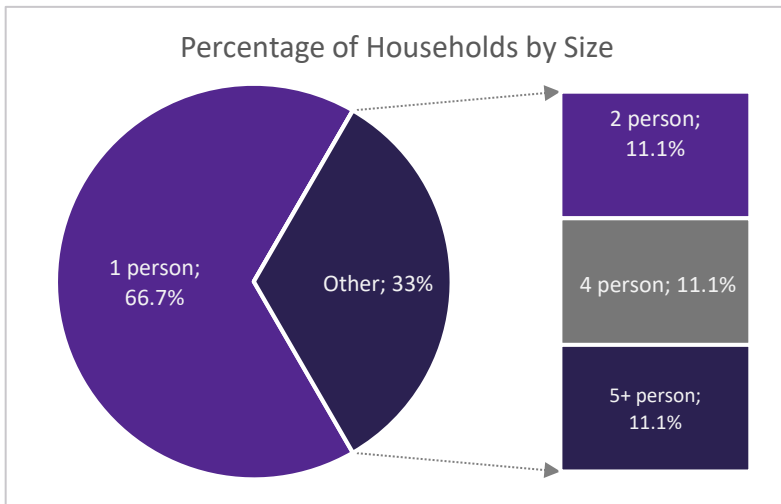
Federal Fiscal Year 2019 Quarter 1 Report

NY-506 - Fulton Montgomery Schoharie Counties

10/1/2018 - 12/31/2018

Overview – All Programs

Between 10/1/2018 and 12/31/2018, providers in Fulton, Montgomery, and Schoharie Counties CoC served 17 people experiencing or at risk of experiencing homelessness.ⁱ Residential programs served 6 peopleⁱⁱ, and supportive services only (SSO) programs served 11 people.ⁱⁱⁱ

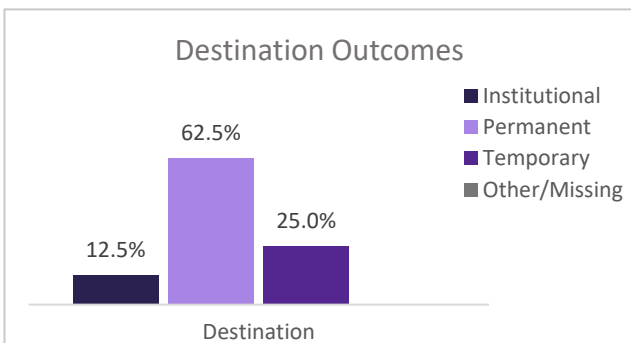
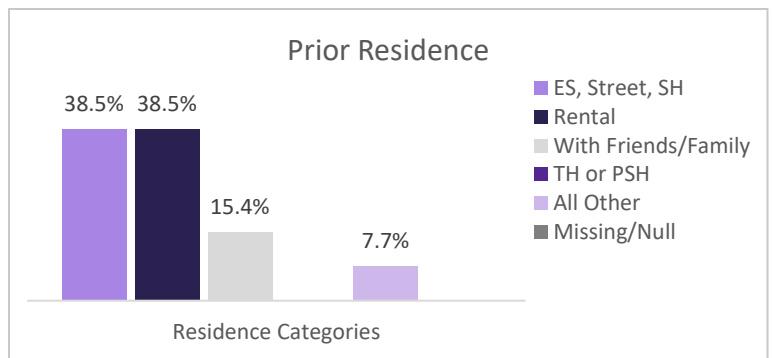


There were 9 households in the CoC, including: 7 households without children (containing 8 individuals), 2 households with both adults and children (containing 5 adults and 4 children), and 0 households of only unaccompanied minors (under 18 years of age.)^{iv}

By gender, providers in the CoC served 9 (52.9%) women, 8 (47.1%) men, and no transgendered or gender non-conforming individuals.

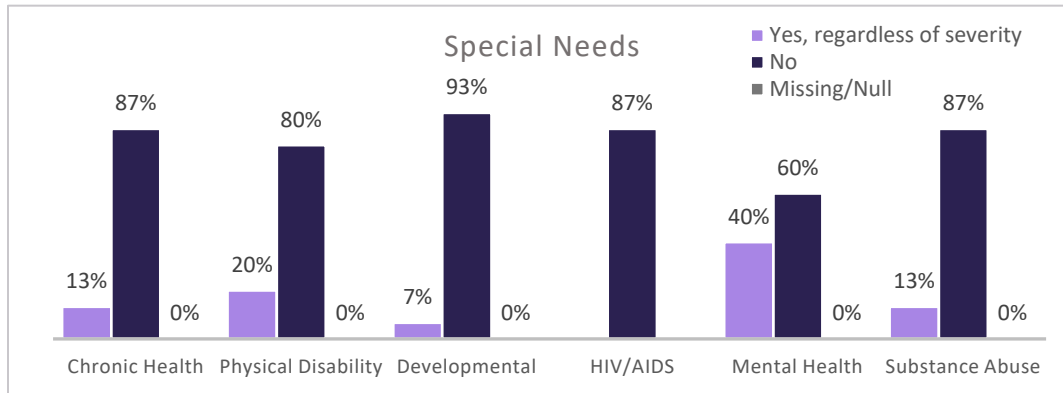
The racial breakdown of those served included: 16 (94.1%) White and 1 (5.9%) Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander. Regardless of race, 10 (58.8%) individuals identified as Hispanic/Latino in ethnicity.^v

Of 13 adults or heads of household, 5 (38.5%) indicated a prior residence of Emergency Shelter, the streets, or Safe Haven. Of these clients, 4 (80.0%) reported one previous episode of homelessness within the last three years.



The total number of individuals discharged during the quarter was 8, which included 5 adults and 3 children. 5 (62.5%) were discharged to a permanent destination. Between admission and discharge, 1 (20.0%) clients over 18 maintained a stable income of greater than zero.

Special Needs – HUD and HHS Funded Programs Only



63.6% of adults (7/11) and 25.0% of children (1/4) in HUD or HHS funded programs self-reported at least one physical, emotional, or other health condition *regardless of whether the condition had become serious enough to be disabling*. When taking severity of condition into account, 3 adults reported conditions that met the criteria to be considered a disability.^{vi}

Sub-Populations – All Programs

1 (9.1%) individuals over 18 met the criteria for chronic homelessness at the time of project entry. 1 out of every 1.8 adults receiving services this quarter was a veteran (54.5%). Out of the 6 veterans served, 4 (66.7%) reported a disabling condition and 1 (16.7%) met the criteria for chronic homelessness at admission. At admission, 4 clients (30.8%) of all clients were considered youth (18-24 years of age.)
