

## **Before Starting the Project Listings for the CoC Priority Listing**

**The FY 2019 CoC Consolidated Application requires TWO submissions. Both this Project Priority Listing AND the CoC Application MUST be submitted prior to the CoC Program Competition deadline as required by the FY 2019 CoC Program Competition NOFA.**

The FY 2019 CoC Priority Listing includes the following:

- Reallocation forms – must be completed if the CoC is reallocating eligible renewal projects to create new projects as described in the FY 2019 CoC Program Competition NOFA.
- New Project Listing – lists all new project applications created through reallocation, the CoC Bonus, and DV Bonus that have been approved and ranked or rejected by the CoC.
- Renewal Project Listing – lists all eligible renewal project applications that have been approved and ranked or rejected by the CoC.
- UFA Costs Project Listing – applicable and only visible for Collaborative Applicants that were designated as a Unified Funding Agency (UFA) during the FY 2019 CoC Program Registration process. Only 1 UFA Costs project application is permitted and can only be submitted by the Collaborative Applicant.
- CoC Planning Project Listing – Only 1 CoC planning project is permitted per CoC and can only be submitted by the Collaborative Applicant.
- YHDP Project Listing – lists the eligible YHDP renewal project for the CoC that must be approved and ranked or rejected by the CoC.
- HUD-2991, Certification of Consistency with the Consolidated Plan – Collaborative Applicants must attach an accurately completed, signed, and dated HUD-2991.

Things to Remember:

- All new, renewal, and YHDP projects must be approved and ranked or rejected on the Project Listings.
- Collaborative Applicants are responsible for ensuring all project applications are accurately appearing on the Project Listings and there are no project applications missing from one or more Project Listings.
- If a project application(s) is rejected by the CoC, the Collaborative Applicant must notify the project applicant(s) no later than 15 days before the CoC Program Competition application deadline outside of e-snaps and include the reason for rejection.

#### **1. Coordinated Entry Position**

**Project Description:** CAPTAIN CHS is applying for Support Services Only (SSO) funding to create a high functioning, robust, and comprehensive Coordinated Entry System, which will serve the entirety of the Saratoga-North Country Continuum of Care's (SNCCoC) HUD-funded agencies, and participating partners, working to prevent, address, and end homelessness in all forms.

**Project Description:** Wellspring requests continued funding to support an RRH program in Saratoga County. This project provides housing and supportive services to individuals and families

who are homeless due to domestic violence and who have a disability of mental illness, chemical dependency, or HIV/AIDS and are actively engaged in treatment. The project assists twelve households (in four one-bedroom, four three-bedroom, and four two-bedroom units) in scattered site apartments, to attain and maintain stable housing and to increase self-sufficiency so they may exit the program to violence-free, sustainable living.

## **2. NewView Rapid Rehousing II**

**Grant Pin:** NY1221

**Project Description:** The proposed project will be a Rapid Rehousing project, with maximum 24-month subsidy. All Wellspring's services and programs are survivor centered, trauma informed and voluntary with a housing first orientation.

## **3. DV Coordinated Entry**

**Project Description:** The proposed project will be a Rapid Rehousing project, with maximum 24-month subsidy. All Wellspring's services and programs are survivor centered, trauma informed and voluntary with a housing first orientation. This project will specifically provide for 6 units to house a minimum of 8 domestic violence survivors.

## **4. NewView – Permanent Supportive (2018)**

**Grant PIN:** NY0184

**Project Description:** Wellspring requests continued funding to support a PSH program in Saratoga County. This project provides housing and supportive services to individuals and families who are homeless due to domestic violence and who have a disability of mental illness, chemical dependency, or HIV/AIDS and are actively engaged in treatment.

## **Saratoga County Rural Preservation Company**

### **5. Center Street Renewal**

**Grant PIN:** NY0188

**Project Description:** Saratoga County Rural Preservation Company requests continued funding to support a PSH program in Saratoga County. This project is designed to house homeless, disabled veterans and their families in permanent housing for a period of time leading to their ability to purchase a home of their own through an established savings program. The families are housed in a two-family home located in Ballston Spa, NY.

### **6. SVAP Renewal**

**Grant PIN:** NY1038

**Project Description:** Saratoga County Rural Preservation Company requests continued funding to support a PSH program in Saratoga County. This project supports fourteen units of permanent supportive housing including four studio apartments, seven one-bedroom apartments, and three two-bedroom apartments. All fourteen units of permanent housing are dedicated to chronically homeless veterans with little or no income. The program adheres to the Housing First Model.

**7. VCHC SVAP Combined**

**Grant Pin: NY1038**

**Project Description:** VCHC is proposing an expansion of the Saratoga Veterans Apartment Program. We are requesting funding to add 7 one-bedroom apartments. Chronically Homeless, disabled veterans with little to no income at the target population for this program. The program will adhere to the Housing First Model, accepting Veterans regardless of income status, active or past due substance abuse, criminal background or history of domestic violence.

**11. TSA - Housing First**

**Project Description:** The Transitional Services Association, Inc. (TSA) requests funds to support a permanent housing program to provide tenant-based rental assistance to 32 homeless households



with disabilities in Saratoga County. These disabilities include mental illness, chronic substance abuse problems, and/or HIV/AIDS. In addition to receiving rental assistance, RAP participants are assisted in accessing supportive services within the community. The proposed project will operate under the Housing First Model.

### 12. WAIT House – TLP Renewal Project

Grant PIN: NY0673

**Project Description:** WAIT House requests continued funding to support a TH program in Saratoga, Warren and Washington Counties. This Transitional Living Program (TLP) project for Homeless Pregnant and Parenting Youth serves homeless youth ages sixteen to 21. The TLP is certified by the NYS Office of Children and Family Services to house up to five mothers and five infants for up to twelve months. The project provides case management, supportive services, and linkages to services to assist the residents in attaining a stable independent living situation in permanent housing and to be able to make healthy choices for themselves and their child. The project is located in Glens Falls, NY and serves youth from Warren, Washington and Saratoga Counties.

## Warren Washington Association for Mental Health

### 13. MHA Warren Washington – Housing First

Grant PIN: NY0716

**Project Description:** Warren Washington Association for Mental Health (WWAMH) requests continued funding to support a PSH program in Hudson Falls, NY. This project supports a total of eighteen-unit apartment buildings providing permanent housing to homeless and chronically homeless adults with mental illness and/or co-occurring substance and alcohol abuse disorders. The project is staffed 24 hours a day and provides supportive services, case management, advocacy and linkages to treatment and community programs for residents. The project's goal is to improve residential stability and increase life skills abilities and self-determination.

**Project Description:** Glens Falls Housing Authority requests continued funding to support a PSH program in Warren and Washington Counties, NY. 
