The FY 2019 CoC Priority Listing includes the following:



RUPCO, Inc.

1. *Ulster County Coordinated Entry 2019*

Project Description: RUPCO is submitting a proposal to request funds to support the development and implementation of the HUD required Coordinated Entry. RUPCO will serve as the lead agency in the Ulster County Coordinated Entry.

2. *Kingston/Ulster County CoC Planning 2019*

Project Description: RUPCO requests funds to support the operations of the CoC. Proposed funds will support coordination and facilitation of the CoC's processes; including strengthening the current CoC system, assisting with the development and implementation of a coordinated assessment system, project evaluation and monitoring, conducting an annual gaps analysis and Point-in-Time Count, participating in the Consolidated Plan, and preparing and submitting the CoC's application to HUD

People USA

3. *People Home Again Project Expansion FY19*

Project Description: People Home Again Project Expansion will increase the number of dedicated beds for chronically homeless individuals and families. The target population for this program will serve those that have been diagnosed with serious and persistent mental illness or co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders. The proposed project will follow a "Housing First" model, ensuring that program participants are housed as quickly as possible; their needs are met through an available menu of services. Ongoing supports (coordinated through continuous assessments) will be provided either directly by People USA or through community linkages to an integrated network of collaborating partner-providers throughout the service area.

4. *Housing Resource Initiative (HRI) 2019*

Project Description: There are three core components to our HRI program (Rapid Re-Housing). These are housing identification, rent and housing assistance (financial), case management and supportive services. Our Housing Resource Initiative will focus on assisting our homeless to move more quickly into permanent Housing with appropriate services and support. One of our expected outcomes includes minimizing the time an individual spends in shelters or on the street. Our Housing Resource Initiative (a Rapid Re-Housing program) target population will be the chronically homeless individuals in Ulster County. We plan to assist four (4) to six (6) individuals in attaining, securing housing, and remaining off the street. These individuals are considered chronically homeless due to the co-occurring conditions that are impacting their ability to stay off the streets. These are, but not limited to, mental health, substance abuse, legal issues, or poor access to community services.

1. *FOW - Midway (2019)*

Grant PIN: 0541

Project Description: The HUD MidWay Transitional living program provides safe shelter and support services for 12 homeless adolescents 16-20 who have no family supports, and when necessary their babies. The program has two sites, each licensed to serve up to 6 adolescents and 3 babies. Youth are

supported to resume or complete their education, gain life and job readiness skills, address issues that are holding them back such as mental illness, substance abuse and/or legal or health issues and become employed.

2. *FOW Adult CMS Families (2019)*

Grant PIN: 0646

Project Description: This program provides 9 units of permanent supportive housing and ongoing support to homeless families of which at least one adult has a history of chronic substance abuse, mental health or physical disability. The project provides case management services to address the long-term issues that led to the family's homelessness and provide life skills training and skill building to assist family members to build vocational skills and independence.

3. *FOW Adult CMS SRO (2019)*

Grant PIN: 0755

Project Description: This program provides sponsor based rental assistance for 24 homeless individuals. This multi-site SRO housing and support program will serve all of Ulster County. This population includes chronically homeless individuals, all of whom will have a disability including young adults, veterans, sex-offenders, mentally ill, or chemically dependent, as well as persons living with HIV/AIDS and victims of domestic violence.

4. *SHP Families (2019)*

Grant PIN: 0647

Project Description: The consolidated SHP Families program provides 21 units of PSH for homeless families. This program will provide rental subsidies and support services for families who were previously homeless and in which the head of household had a disability. The apartments will be scattered throughout Ulster County and the rent for them will in part be underwritten by this grant, with the additional funding coming from either the Public Assistance Living Allowance, or 30% of the household's income. The funds will be used to provide case management services to address the long-term issues that led to the family's homelessness and provide life skills training and skill building to assist family members to build vocational skills and independence.

5. *FOW RRH DVS (2019)*

Grant PIN: 1128

Project Description: The Rapid Re-housing for domestic violence survivors provides 5 units located throughout Ulster County for survivors of domestic and dating violence, sexual assault and stalking. The apartments will be scattered site and the locations will be determined based upon the individual or family's safety, and availability of transportation to access services, training and employment. The sizes of the units will vary based upon need, and will serve 5 families, with a total of 12 individuals. All adults in the program will be provided trauma counseling as needed; and assistance to develop an individual services plan with appropriate support services.

6. *FOW RRH Families (2019)*

Grant PIN: 1181

Project Description: The Rapid Re-housing for families provides 6 units located throughout Ulster County rental subsidies and support services for families who were previously homeless. This program

will be provided trauma counseling as needed; and assistance to develop an individual services plan with appropriate support services.

7. *FOW DV CE (2019)*

Grant PIN: 1242

Project Description: Family of Woodstock Inc., operates the Domestic Violence Shelter and coordinated support services for victims of domestic violence and their families. The project will provide dedicated staff to coordinate and lead in the development and implementation of the Ulster CoC’s Domestic Violence Coordinated entry.

Support services are provided in a cross system collaborating/partnership with community providers to deliver services that are trauma informed and recovery based. Participants are encouraged to make choices about their recovery promoting empowerment to move towards independence and overall wellness. The People Home Again project staff also offer peer delivered services that focus on fostering recovery, community self-help meetings, social opportunities, vocational and volunteer opportunities, entitlement education and the development of Change plans that help people maintain wellness.
