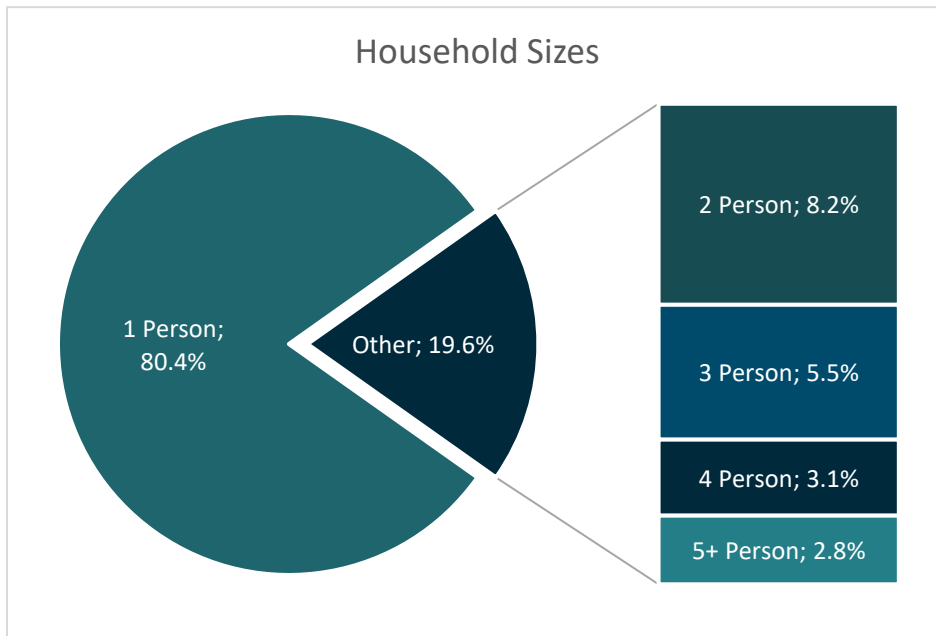


NY-523 - Glen Falls/Saratoga Springs/Saratoga County CoC

Overview – All Programs

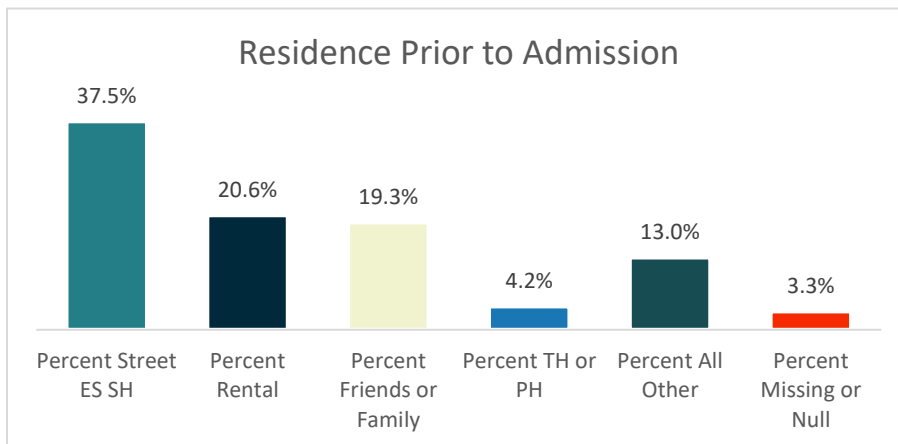
Between 10/1/2018 and 9/30/2019, providers in the Saratoga CoC served 1246 people experiencing or at risk of experiencing homelessness.ⁱ Residential programs served 930 individuals a total of 1156 times, and supportive services-only programs served 316 individuals a total of 323 times.^{ii, iii}



There were 862 households in the CoC, including: 646 households without children (containing 685 individuals), 135 households with both adults and children (containing 193 adults and 258 children), and 81 households of only unaccompanied minors (under 18 years of age), containing 81 minors.^{iv}

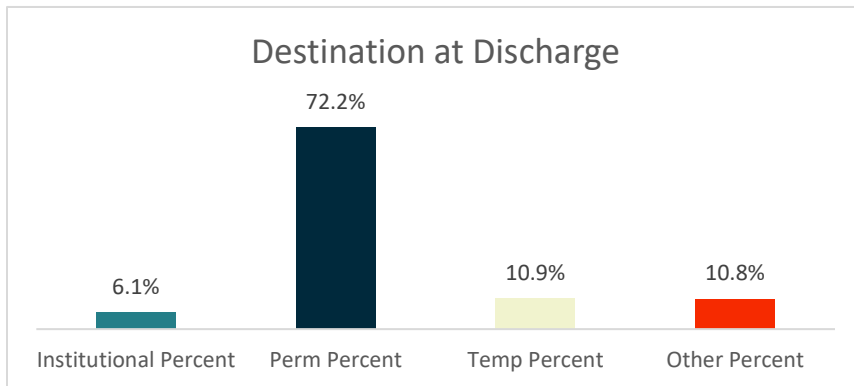
By gender, providers in the CoC served 514 (41.3%) women, 696 (55.9%) men and 5 (0.4%) trans-identified individuals.

The racial breakdown of those served included: 944 (75.8%) White, 169 (13.6%) Black or African-American, 2 (0.2%) Asian, 1 (0.1%) Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, 6 (0.5%) American Indian or Alaskan Native, and 60 (4.8%) Multiple Races.^v Regardless of race, 75 (6.0%) individuals identified as Hispanic/Latino in ethnicity.^{vi}



Of 952 adults or heads of household, 357 (37.5%) indicated a prior residence of Emergency Shelter, the streets, or Safe Haven. Of these clients, 180 (50.4%) reported one previous episode of homelessness within the last three years. 57 (16.0%), 30 (8.4%), and 67 (18.8%) reported that they had been 2, 3, or 4+ times homeless (respectively) during the same time frame. 23 (6.4%) did not report on this data element.

Of the adults or heads of household who were in program a year or more and received an annual assessment (114), 46 (40.4%) saw an increase in income (cash and cash benefits) between admission and their most recent update, while 26 (22.8%) maintained a stable income of greater than zero.

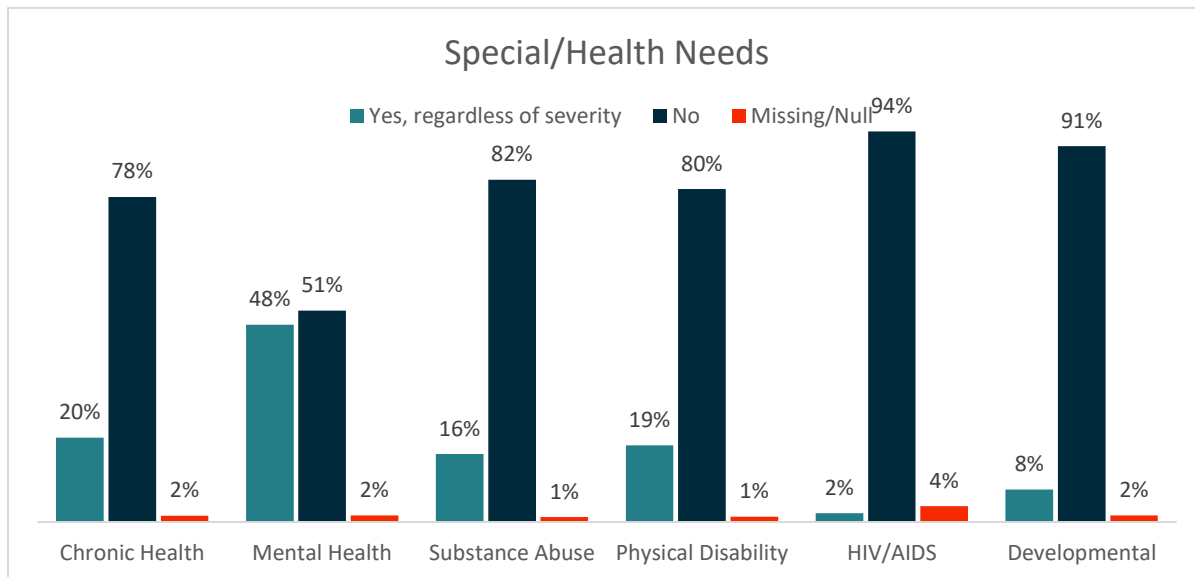


The total number of individuals discharged during the year was 759, which included 527 adults and 232 children. 548 (72.2%) were discharged to a permanent destination. Between admission and discharge, income for 32 (6.1%) clients over 18 rose, while 253 (48.0%) clients over 18 maintained a stable income of greater than zero.

Sub-Populations – All Programs

46 (5.5%) individuals over 18 met the criteria for chronic homelessness at the time of project entry.^{vii} 1 out of every 3.4 adults receiving services this year was a veteran (29.6%). Out of the 247 veterans served, 158 (64.0%) reported a disabling condition and 19 (7.7%) met the criteria for chronic homelessness at admission. At admission, 143 clients (16.3%) of all clients were considered youth (18-24 years of age.)

Special Needs – HUD and HHS Funded Programs Only



75.3% of adults (327/434) and 36.4% of children (88/242) in HUD or HHS funded programs self-reported at least one physical, emotional, or other health condition *regardless of whether the condition had become serious enough to be disabling*. Among those reporting multiple conditions, the most significant comorbidity was Mental Health and Substance Use (85). When taking severity of condition into account, 220 adults reported conditions that met the criteria to be considered a disability.^{viii}

ⁱⁱ For this report, all Permanent Housing (Housing Only, Housing with Services, Permanent Supportive Housing, and Rapid Re-Housing) and Transitional Housing are residential; Street Outreach, Homelessness Prevention, Day Shelter, and Services Only Program enrollments are Supportive Services.

ⁱⁱⁱ "Persons Served" totals only: if an individual client is served by **BOTH** Residential and Supportive Services within the same report period, the client is counted once in **EACH** total; therefore, adding these together may equal more than the total unduplicated number of persons served. Only new enrollments for the quarter are included for Supportive Services.

^{iv} Data based on **current** age and household composition, which may differ from information reported at admission.

^v For this report, all clients self-identifying with more than one race are counted within the "Multiple Races" category.

^{vi} HUD collects Ethnicity information under the rationale: "To indicate clients who do and do not identify themselves as Hispanic or Latino."
