


CRHMIS Quarterly Report: 2019 Q4

Overview - All Programs

Between 7/1/2019 and 9/30/2019, providers in the Dutchess CoC served 1489 people experiencing or at risk of experiencing homelessness.ⁱ Residential programs served 1259 individuals a total of 2541 times, and supportive services-only programs served 230 individuals a total of 249 times.^{ii, iii}




There were 1037 households in the CoC, including: 846 households without children (containing 866 individuals), 155 households with both adults and children (containing 187 adults and 270 children), and 36 households of only unaccompanied minors (under 18 years of age), containing 46 minors. iv

By gender, providers in the CoC served 625 (42.0%) women, 743 (49.9%) men, 1 (0.1%) transidentified individuals.

The racial breakdown of those served included: 639 (42.9%) White, 631 (42.4%) Black or African-American, 1 (0.1%) Asian, 11 (0.7%) Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, 14 (0.9%) American Indian or Alaskan Native, and 60 (4.0%) Multiple Baces v


Of 1069 adults or heads of household, 402 (37.6%) indicated a prior residence of Emergency Shelter, the streets, or Safe Haven. Of these clients, 233 (58.0%) reported one previous episode of homelessness within the last three years. 53 (13.2%), 44 (10.9%), and 69 (17.2%) reported that they had been 2, 3, or 4+ times homeless (respectively) during the same time frame. 3 (0.7%) did not report on this data element.



Of the adults or heads of household who

were in program a year or more and received an annual assessment (195), 60 (30.8%) saw an increase in income

(cash and cash benefits) between admission and their most recent update, while 104 (53.3%) maintained a stable income of greater than zero.




The total number of individuals discharged during the year was 457, which included 345 adults and 112 children. 143 (31.3%) were discharged to a permanent destination. Between admission and discharge, income for 6 (1.7%) clients over 18 rose, while 98 (28.4%) clients over 18 maintained a stable income of greater than zero.

Sub-Populations – All Programs

57 (5.5%) individuals over 18 met the criteria for chronic homelessness at the time of project entry. ^{vii} 1 out of every 15.0 adults receiving services this year was a veteran (6.7%). Out of the 69 veterans served, 30 (43.5%) reported a disabling condition and 3 (4.3%) met the criteria for chronic homelessness at admission. At admission, 121 clients (11.5%) of all clients were considered youth (18-24 years of age.)

Special Needs - HUD and HHS Funded Programs Only



62.8% of adults (396/631) and 21.6% of children (25/116) in HUD or HHS funded programs self-reported at least one physical, emotional, or other health condition *regardless of whether the condition had become serious enough to be disabling*. Among those reporting multiple conditions, the most significant comorbidity was Mental Health and Substance Use (129). When taking severity of condition into account, 268 adults reported conditions that met the criteria to be considered a disability. VIII

Only new enrollments for the quarter are included for Supportive Services.
