We received word on Monday October 28th that HDX had opened for CoC's to submit their FY2017 System Performance Measures Report. Allyson, Terry, and Kelli all met on Tuesday to timeline the process.

- 2. The Fall 2019 RHY-HMIS Data Submission is now open! RHY Grantees have until November 15th to upload their data covering service activity in the period of 10/1/18-9/30/19. Remember: There is only 1 authorized RHYPoint User (usually the Executive Director) at each agency, and this authorization is granted directly from RHYPoint, not the CRHMIS team.

RHY-HMIS data is submitted by completing the following steps:

- Generate a RHY Upload File from HMIS;
- Log into RHYPoint (<u>www.RHYHMIS.net</u>) and;
- Attach the file to upload [Done separately for each grant/project]

Kelli will be reaching out during the first week of November to address any validation errors within the RHY Upload Files that need to be corrected for successful submission.

VA/SSVF Updates

From the FY2020 VA HMIS Programs Manual Regarding SSVF:

- New: Starting in FY 2020, SSVF grantees will have an additional project set up in HMIS to capture data about veterans who have "Problem Solving" or "Rapid Resolution" conversations with SSVF-funded case managers.
- These new projects are required to use the "14-Coordinated Entry" or "6-Services Only" project type (depending on local set up and needs for Coordinated Entry data collection at the CoC level) and are required to record data for upload to the SSVF repository using element "4.20-Coordinated Entry Event" to document those conversations.
- HMIS Leads and System Administrators are to provide an HMIS project for recording these conversations, and to work with local Coordinated Entry data collection Leads to reduce or eliminate data entry burden on SSVF case managers when these conversations are required by the CoC to be recorded in the local CE project as well.

Kelli will be reaching out to agencies with SSVF funding to ensure these projects are set up correctly in the CRHMIS.

NHSDC Take-Aways

Hands down this was one of the BEST NHSDC Conferences I have attended. The sessions were super informative, and relative to the work we do on the CRHMIS team! Here are some takeaways from Rachel and Kelsey who also attended:

Rachel: My favorite session was without a doubt the one on governance and enforceable agreements, with the Data Quality Management Program being a close second.

Biggest take away from it all was that as HMIS leads we have the ability and responsibility to support the community in maximizing their funding through clean data. This is achieved through partnership with the organizations we serve, and only through a collective effort are we able to achieve pristine data quality. I also very much enjoyed the food, tried salmon for the first time and am now a fan!

Kelsey: C4 Innovations conducted a racial equity analysis on CE Tools; the report is now available **here**.

There was a session on Strategies for Evaluation and Monitoring CE, which our CE Leads are well underway with the support of the CARES Planning Team.

VAWA regulation review clarified who should be entering/not entering into HMIS, as well as what qualifies as a comparable database. They also reaffirmed those utilizing a comparable database should have a completely different philosophy on data collection than those entering into HMIS (i.e. collect the minimum amount of information a survivor of Domestic Violence is interested in sharing; ensure confidentiality and privacy; only share PII with written, informed, time-limited consent or via aggregate data). Techsafety.org has a confidentiality toolkit.
