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Introduction

Each CoC across the country is required to submit the HMIS Longitudinal System Analysis (LSA) at the end of each federal fiscal year. Every CoC's LSA submission is then compiled into the Annual Homeless Assessment Report (AHAR) given to Congress. It provides nationwide estimates of homelessness, including information about the demographic characteristics of homeless persons, service use patterns, and the capacity to house homeless persons. It informs strategic planning for federal, state, and local initiatives designed to prevent and end homelessness.

At the local level, the LSA can also be used by communities who want to better understand the number, characteristics, and service needs of people using homeless services for their CoC application, community planning activities, coordinated entry system planning, strategic plans to end homelessness, consolidated plans, or funding applications. The Cares Collaborative HMIS has modified the HMIS Annual Report to use the LSA data in order to ensure that the data being used in all reporting formats retains consistency and aligns with the HUD data visualization and reporting system [Stella](#). The NY-602 Newburgh, Middletown/Orange County CoC LSA is a deduplicated report generated from client reported data entered in the CARES Collaborative HMIS (CCHMIS) by the Continuum's Contributing Homeless Organizations (CHOs), as listed in Appendix B. If a CoC does not have 100% HMIS participation from Homeless Services Providers (other than providers that are **prohibited* from HMIS participation) this report is not 100% reflective of the community.

**Domestic Violence projects are prohibited by law from participation in the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) and are not included in this report.*

Reading this Report

For those people and households served by continuum projects during the fiscal year, the LSA includes:

- Demographic characteristics like age, race, gender, and veteran status
 - The LSA reports demographic data for Heads of Household and adults only.
 - Children Only Households do not report on veteran status.
- Length of time homeless and patterns of system use.
- Information specific to populations whose needs and/or eligibility for services may differ from the broader homeless population, such as veterans and people and households experiencing chronic homelessness; and
- Housing outcomes for those who exit the homeless services system.

More detailed demographic data can be found in the tables throughout this report separated by the three HUD defined household types:

- Adults and Children (under 18) - AC
- Adults Only (all household members at least 18 years of age) - AO

- Children Only (all household members are under 18 years of age, including parenting teens) - CO

Within each table, the total numbers reported for each data point are separated by the following HMIS Project Groups:

The LSA also provides information about patterns of system use prior to exit, destination types, and, for those who were served again later by continuum projects, lengths of time between exit and re-engagement or returns to homelessness.

In addition to providing information for the persons and households served during the report period, the LSA includes additional data about households and populations who exited the system in three distinct periods:

1. Those that exited two years prior to the report period
2. Those that exited one year prior to the report period
3. Those that exited in the first six months of the report period.

Key LSA Concepts**

LSA Concept	Core Information Relevant to the LSA
Adult and Child Household (AC)	A household in which at least one household member is age 18 or older and at least one household member is age 17 or younger at entry or report start, whichever is later. AC households must include at least one adult and one child with valid dates of birth, but may also include household members of unknown age.
Adult Only Household (AO)	A household in which all household members have valid dates of birth and are age 18 or older at entry or report start, whichever is later.
Child Only Household (CO)	A household in which all household members have valid dates of birth and are age 17 or younger at entry or report start, whichever is later.
Chronically Homeless	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ A “homeless individual with a disability,” as defined in the Act, who: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Lives in a place not meant for human habitation, a safe haven, or in an emergency shelter; and ▪ Has been homeless (as described above) continuously for at least 12 months or on at least 4 separate occasions in the last 3 years where the combined occasions must total at least 12 months <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. Enrollment	A period in which a person receives services from a given project, beginning with the Project Start Date recorded in HMIS and ending on the Project Exit Date.
Exit Cohorts	Groups of households who exited from a continuum SO, ES, SH, TH, RRH, and/or PSH project in a given exit cohort period and have no record of any enrollment in an ES, SH, TH, RRH, and/or PSH project during the following 14 days. There are three exit cohort periods – and thus three exit cohorts – included in the LSA. Households that meet the criteria for inclusion in multiple exit cohorts are counted in each
Household Served	One or more clients served together in one or more continuum ES, SH, TH, RRH, and/or PSH projects at any time during the report period (or appropriate exit cohort period). Each household has a head of household and a distinct household type based on the ages of each household member.

Seniors/55+ Households	An AO household in which all adults in the household are 55 or older at entry or report start, whichever is later.
First-time homeless	An AO, CO, or AC household that entered a continuum ES, SH, TH, RRH, or PSH project during the report period and was not enrolled in such projects at any point in the two years prior to entry.
Project Group	ES, SH, and TH (combined), RRH (only), and PSH (only). Demographics reporting for the active cohort is produced separately for each of these three project groups. People and households served in more than one project group are included in reporting for each group in which they were served.
Rapid Re-housing (RRH)	<p>Rapid Re-Housing projects.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ RRH clients who are homeless at project entry based on 3.917 Living Situation are considered to be experiencing homelessness until a documented 3.20 Housing Move-In Date or exit, whichever comes first.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ For clients who were in ES/SH or on the street at project entry, all time between Approximate Date Started and move-in is counted in determining chronic homelessness.
