Memo Overview and Intention

This memorandum summarizes highlights from the 2022 Housing Inventory Chart (HIC) and Point-in-Time Count (PIT). The HIC-PIT was submitted on or before May 6th, 2022 according to HUD's requirement. This data is being shared with homeless shelter and housing providers to identify 2022 HIC and PIT outcomes that will impact the CoC Application score. Please report any errors and/or questions to the CARES Planning Team.

2022 Housing Inventory Summary

Continuums are required to report annually on the number of available beds dedicated to homeless persons; these beds include emergency, transitional and permanent housing. Below is a summary of changes within these beds from 2021 to 2022.

Emergency Housing:

- *Emergency Year-Round Beds:* The number of emergency year-round beds increased by 138, from 396 in 2021 to 534 in 2022.
 - **Broome County DSS Motel** increased from 92 to 234.
 - Broome County DSS ESG-CV decreased from 20 to 10.
 - **Opportunities for Delaware ESG-CV** decreased from 20 to 2.
 - OFO Emergency Housing Shelter decreased from 22 to 9.
 - Otsego DSS ES/Motels increased from 33 to 52.
 - **YWCA of Binghamton** increased from 14 to 32.
- *Emergency Overflow Beds:* The number of overflow beds decreased by 2, from 7 in 2021 to 5 in 2022.
- *Emergency Seasonal Beds:* The number of seasonal beds remained the same at o beds.
- **Transitional Beds:** The number of transitional beds decreased by 29, from 73 in 2021 to 44 in 2022.
 - YMCA Men's Transitional decreased from 58 to 29.
- Permanent Housing Beds:
 - *Permanent Supportive Housing:* Permanent supportive housing beds increased by 66, from 409 in 2021 to 475 in 2022, mostly due to utilization and/or family composition or new projects being added to the HIC.



- YMCA Adult Housing added 29 beds.
- **YWCA Endicott Square** added 41 beds.
- Fairview Recovery Services Shelter Plus Care increased from 39 to 41.
- Family Enrichment Network FEN Housing Connections decreased from 40 to 28.
- **Opportunities for Broome HHAP1** increased from 21 to 28.
- **YWCA of Binghamton NYSHIP 1** increased from 22 to 25.
- **YWCA of Binghamton NYSHIP 2** decreased from 6 to 7.
- **YWCA of Binghamton NYSHIP 3** decreased from 15 to 12.
- *Rapid Rehousing:* The Rapid Rehousing bed count increased by 45 beds, from 141 in 2021 to 186 in 2022.
 - Broome County DSS ESG-CV RRH added 8 beds.
 - Catholic Charities of Cortland RRH increased from 27 to 33 beds.
 - Catholic Charities of Cortland ESG-CV RRH added 9 beds.
 - Family Enrichment Network ESG-CV RRH added 12 beds.
 - **Opportunities for Broome RRH CoC Wide** decreased from 49 to 22 beds.
 - **Opportunities for Delaware NYS ESG RRH** increased from 10 to 15 beds.
 - **Opportunities for Delaware NYS ESG DOINC RRH** added 15 beds.
 - YWCA of Binghamton RRH decreased from 55 to 39.
- **Rapid Rehousing for Families:** The Rapid Rehousing bed count for families decreased by 10 beds, from 78 in 2021 to 68 in 2022.
 - Broome County DSS ESG-CV RRH added 4 family beds.
 - Catholic Charities of Cortland RRH increased from 10 to 19 family beds.
 - Catholic Charities of Cortland ESG-CV RRH added 5 family beds.
 - Family Enrichment Network ESG-CV RRH added 7 family beds.
 - **Opportunities for Broome RRH CoC Wide** decreased from 38 to 11 family beds.
 - **Opportunities for Delaware NYS ESG RRH** increased from 2 to 5 family beds.
 - Opportunities for Delaware NYS ESG DOINC RRH added 5 family beds.
 - YWCA of Binghamton RRH decreased from 28 to 9 family beds.

Sheltered PIT Breakdown

- When comparing the 2022 (416 persons) sheltered PIT with the 2021 (318 persons) sheltered PIT, an increase in the total number of persons sheltered is noted.
- In total, there was an increase of 98 persons utilizing services on the night of the count with a 101person increase in the use of Emergency Shelters and a 3-person decrease in use of transitional services.

NOTE: The increase in sheltered individuals may have a negative effect on this year's NOFA application scoring.

Sheltered PIT Subpopulation Information

- *Chronically Homeless Individuals:* The number of sheltered chronically homeless individuals increased by 15, from 0 in 2021 to15 in 2022.
- *Chronically Homeless Families*: The number of sheltered chronically homeless households remained at o..
- *Chronically Homeless Vets*: The number of sheltered chronically homeless veterans increased from o in 2021 to 1 in 2022.
- *Chronically Homeless Youth:* The number of sheltered chronically homeless youth increased from o in 2021 to 1 in 2022.
- *Adults with a Serious Mental Illness:* The number of sheltered persons with serious mental illness increased from 83 in 2021 to 120 in 2022.
- *Adults with a Substance Use Disorder*: The number of sheltered persons with substance abuse disorders increased from 68 in 2021 to 96 in 2022.
- *Adults with HIV/AIDS:* The number of sheltered persons with HIV/AIDS increased from 1 in 2021 to 2 in 2022.
- *Victims of Domestic Violence*: The number of sheltered persons noting DV decreased from 6 in 2021 to 4 in 2022.

NOTE: Special populations (e.g., persons living with HIV/AIDS) often do not disclose their status which may indicate a lower than actual total number reported.

Unsheltered PIT breakdown

In 2021 HUD provided NY-511 with a full exemption from the unsheltered PIT count due to the COVID-19 crisis. As a result, no data was gathered on those experiencing unsheltered homelessness therefore no comparisons could be made in the data below.

• There were 67 persons noted in the 2022 unsheltered PIT.
