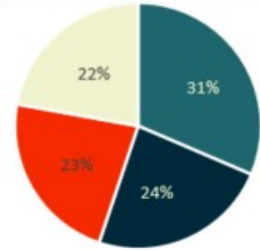


# Albany HOME-ARP Public Survey Fact Sheet

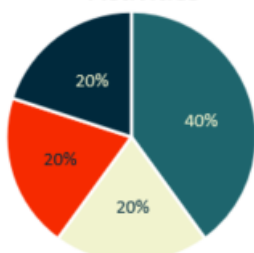
Public survey participants **prioritized Affordable Housing Development** among eligible activities. Development of Shelters with Individual Units (or Non-Congregate Shelters) was voted as the second highest priority. The nearly evenly split recommendations show, there is a need for funding for all eligible activities.

Activities Recommended for Prioritization



- Affordable Housing Development
- Acquisitions and Development of Non-Congregate Shelters
- Support Services
- Tenant Based Rental Assistance

- Affordable Housing Development
- Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA)
- Support Services
- Acquisitions and Development of Non-Congregate Shelters

In terms of funding allocation, a majority of public survey participants preferred to **allocate:**

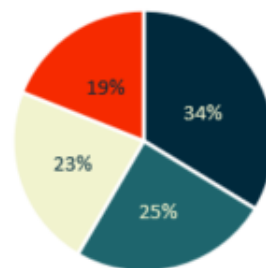
- 20% to Tenant Based Rental Assistance
- 20% to Support Services
- 20% to Acquisitions and Development of Non-Congregate Shelters
- 40% of fund allocation for Affordable Housing Development.

**This funding allocation suggestion mirrors that of Stakeholder's suggestions.**

Public survey participants prioritized the need of qualifying populations within the City of Albany as follows:

- **1st Priority: Homeless**
- **2nd Priority: At-risk of homelessness**
- **3rd Priority: Fleeing or Attempting to Flee Domestic Violence, Sexual Assault, Stalking, or Human Trafficking**
- **4th Priority: Other populations experiencing or at greatest risk of housing**

Prioritization Recommendations for Qualifying Populations



- Homeless
- At-risk of Homelessness
- Fleeing or Attempting to Flee Domestic Violence, Sexual Assault, Stalking, or Human Trafficking
- Other Populations Experiencing or At Greatest Risk of Housing Instability

## Survey Marketing and Participation:

**145 individuals from 60 organizations** were invited to distribute the public survey to their staff and clients, including City Councilors for dissemination to their constituents, and other organizations that host citizen listservs. Additionally, the survey was posted on CARES' website.

## Recommended prioritizations of subpopulations:

- Persons with Severe Mental Illness
- Households who have been chronically homeless
- Victims/Survivors of Domestic Violence, Sexual Assault, Stalking or Human Trafficking
- Persons exiting the criminal justice system
- Persons in unsheltered situations

## Feedback:

Feedback from public participants included the need for housing to address racial disparities. 44% of respondents reported a need to target resources for Black, Indigenous, and Persons of Color (BIPOC). Additionally, housing for those with physical disabilities, severe mental illness and LGBTQ+ affirming and safe housing is needed.
