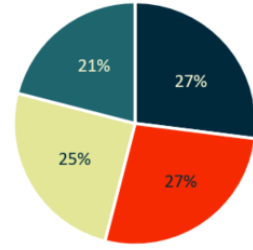


# Albany HOME-ARP Stakeholder Survey Fact Sheet

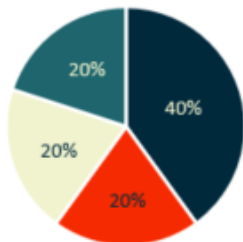
Stakeholders evenly prioritized **Affordable Housing Development and Acquisition and Development of Non-Congregate Shelters**. However, those activities barely surpassed the voting for Support Services and Tenant Based Rental Assistance. This tells us, **there is a need for funding within all activities**.

Activities Recommended for Prioritization



- Affordable Housing Development - 1st Priority
- Acquisitions and Development of Non-Congregate Shelters - 1st Priority
- Support Services - 2nd Priority
- Tenant Based Rental Assistance - 3rd Priority

Percentage of Funding Recommendations for Activities



- Affordable Housing Development
- Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA)
- Support Services
- Acquisitions and Development of Non-Congregate Shelters

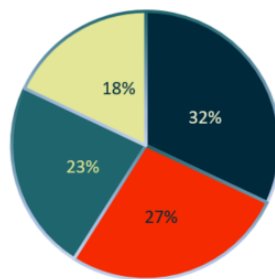
In terms of funding allocation, a majority of stakeholders preferred to **allocate:**

- 20% to Tenant Based Rental Assistance
- 20% to Support Services
- 20% to Acquisitions and Development of Non-Congregate Shelters
- 40% of fund allocation for Affordable Housing Development.

Stakeholders prioritized the need of qualifying populations within the City of Albany as such:

- **1st Priority: Homeless**
- **2nd Priority: At-risk of homelessness**
- **3rd Priority: Fleeing or Attempting to Flee Domestic Violence, Sexual Assault, Stalking, or Human Trafficking**
- **4th Priority: Other populations experiencing or at greatest risk of housing instability**

Prioritization Recommendations for Qualifying Populations (QPs)



- Homeless - 1st Priority
- At-risk of Homelessness - 2nd Priority
- Fleeing or Attempting to Flee Domestic Violence, Sexual Assault, Stalking, or Human Trafficking - 3rd Priority
- Other Populations Experiencing or At Greatest Risk of Housing Instability - 4th Priority

## Participation Numbers:

**145 individuals from 60 organizations** that serve the qualifying and underserved populations were invited to participate.

**26 participants from 21 organizations responded!**

## Recommended prioritizations of subpopulations:

- Households who have been chronically homeless
- Persons exiting the criminal justice system
- Persons in unsheltered situations
- Persons with severe mental illness
- Persons with substance use disorder

## Feedback:

Feedback from stakeholders included the need for housing that is actively affirming of and safe for LGBTQ+ clients, youth, and housing to address racial disparities. Stakeholders also emphasized the need for affordable housing units and continued support services to reduce homelessness and increase housing stability in the community.
