Dutchess County CoC Planning Project

Project Description: The County of Dutchess requests funds to support the operations of the CoC. Project Description: The County of Dutchess requests continued funding to support tenant rental assistance for 10 units of permanent supportive housing: 5 one-bedrooms designated for chronically homeless (CH) adults and 5 units (4 two-bedrooms and 1 three-bedroom) for eligible homeless adults and their families. At capacity S+C can serve 10 eligible adults and 8 of their family members (generally non-disabled children). The target population is homeless/chronically homeless adults disabled due to SPMI, though many have other needs as well.

Project Description: The County of Dutchess requests continued funding to support tenant-based rental assistance for 12 units of Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) in Dutchess County, NY serving 12 homeless adults disabled due to chronic substance abuse or Severe and Persistent Mental Illness (SPMI). Depending on household composition HBI can serve up to 18 individuals: 8 unaccompanied adults in 8 one-bedroom units (one bed designated for chronically homeless) and 4 eligible adults with their families in 2 two-bedroom and 2 three-bedroom units.

MARC Shelter Plus Care**Grant Pin: NY0432**

Project Description: The County of Dutchess requests continued funding to support 14 units, containing 21 beds, for homeless individuals and families in recovery from substance use disorders. Many of our participants also struggle with co-occurring mental health and/or physical disabilities. The program provides a range of case management and vocational services including individual and group counseling, assessment and referral, life skills training, budgeting, nutritional counseling, job coaching and facilitates participation in a sober support network. The program works closely with other service providers within and outside the COC including physical health, mental health, substance abuse treatment, educational and job training agencies. Participants are required to contribute 30% of their monthly income towards rent.

MHA S Plus C 12

Project Description: The County of Dutchess requests continued funding to support 12 units/beds of permanent housing in Dutchess County for homeless individuals struggling with substance use and psychiatric disorders. Services to be offered to all clients include case management, employment and vocational counseling, substance use counseling, mental health counseling, crisis intervention, life skills training and recovery support network development. The overall goal of the program is to provide stable, safe, affordable housing with supportive services to assist participants to become self-sufficient and fully integrated into the mainstream community.

HRH River Haven Transitional Living

Project Description: Hudson River Housing requests continued funding to support transitional housing (TH) for unaccompanied homeless young adults ages 18-25 in Dutchess County, NY. The Project can serve up to 8 young adults who share 4 SRO units that are clustered together at the site. TLC will participate in the CoC's emerging Coordinated Entry System and currently draws referrals from shelters and through street outreach.

HRH Shelter Plus Care

Grant Pin: NY0431

Project Description: The County of Dutchess requests continued funding to support tenant rental assistance for 10 units of permanent supportive housing: 5 one-bedrooms designated for chronically homeless (CH) adults and 5 units (4 two-bedrooms and 1 three-bedroom) for eligible homeless adults and their families. At capacity S+C can serve 10 eligible adults and 8 of their family members (generally non-disabled children). The target population is homeless/chronically homeless adults disabled due to SPMI, though many have other needs as well.

HRH Home Base I**Grant Pin: NY0429**

Project Description: The County of Dutchess requests continued funding to support tenant-based rental assistance for 12 units of Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) in Dutchess County, NY serving 12 homeless adults disabled due to chronic substance abuse or Severe and Persistent Mental Illness (SPMI). Depending on household composition HBI can serve up to 18 individuals: 8 unaccompanied adults in 8 one-bedroom units (one bed designated for chronically homeless) and 4 eligible adults with their families in 2 two-bedroom and 2 three-bedroom units.

MARC Shelter Plus Care**Grant Pin: NY0432**

Project Description: The County of Dutchess requests continued funding to support 14 units, containing 21 beds, for homeless individuals and families in recovery from substance use disorders. Many of our participants also struggle with co-occurring mental health and/or physical disabilities. The program provides a range of case management and vocational services including individual and group counseling, assessment and referral, life skills training, budgeting, nutritional counseling, job coaching and facilitates participation in a sober support network. The program works closely with other service providers within and outside the COC including physical health, mental health, substance abuse treatment, educational and job training agencies. Participants are required to contribute 30% of their monthly income towards rent.

MHA S Plus C 12

Project Description: The County of Dutchess requests continued funding to support 12 units/beds of permanent housing in Dutchess County for homeless individuals struggling with substance use and psychiatric disorders. Services to be offered to all clients include case management, employment and vocational counseling, substance use counseling, mental health counseling, crisis intervention, life skills training and recovery support network development. The overall goal of the program is to provide stable, safe, affordable housing with supportive services to assist participants to become self-sufficient and fully integrated into the mainstream community.
