HOME-ARP PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The American Rescue Plan (ARP) provides \$5 billion nationally to assist individuals or households who are homeless, at risk of homelessness, and other vulnerable populations, by providing housing, rental assistance, supportive services, and noncongregate shelter, to **reduce homelessness** and **increase housing stability** across the country.

The Consortium (Cities of Schenectady & Troy, Town of Colonie) have been allocated

\$3.8 million through this program.

HOME-ARP program activities are funded through

HOME-ARP PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Eligible Activities

Development of Shelters with Individual Units

• to provide emergency housing for persons experiencing homelessness.

Affordable Housing Development

• to provide more affordable housing.

Tenant Based Rental Assistance

• to provide financial rental support. (i.e.: rent, security deposits, utility deposits, utility costs)

Support Services

• to ensure ongoing stable housing (including eviction prevention).



HOME-ARP PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Qualifying Populations

HOME-ARP funds can be used to support any of the following qualifying populations

(as defined by HUD in HOME-ARP Notice)

Homeless

At-risk of Homelessness

At-risk of Homelessness

Other Populations Experiencing or At Greatest Risk of Housing Instability

The population of Homelessness (as defined by HUD in HOME-ARP Notice)

Fleeing or Attempting to Flee Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault, Stalking, or Human Trafficking

previously homeless households with temporary assistance

households with annual income below 30% AMI who are severely cost burdened households with annual income below 50% AMI and are at risk of homelessness, etc.

ALLOCATION PLAN REQUIREMENTS

Community Consultation

To receive the HOME-ARP funds, the Consortium must engage in a consultation and public participation process and develop a HOME-ARP allocation plan that identifies how it will prioritize:



PRELIMINARY RESEARCH AND OUTREACH

Recommended Priorities for Funded Activities for HOME-ARP

Please note 15% of funds will be used for administration and planning



- Affordable Housing Development
- Supportive Services
- Tenant-based Rental Assistance
- Development of Non-congregate Shelter

Affordable Housing Development

\$1,700,000 (44% of total funding)

Populations served:

Homeless; survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, and human trafficking

Recommendation:

Prioritize units for those who are homelessness and fleeing domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking.

- Stakeholders reported unutilized rental assistance and Housing Choice Vouchers as a result of low vacancy rates and a lack of quality, affordable housing to marry rental assistance with.
- Stakeholders reported a number of projects that could utilize funding to finish development, given the increase in construction costs over the last two years.
- Public survey results supported a higher percentage of funds going towards affordable rental housing development.

Supportive Services

\$620,000 (16% of total funding)

Populations served:

Homeless; survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, and human trafficking at-risk of homelessness

Recommendations:

Support Service funding **potentially including**:

Mobile Crisis/mental health, street outreach

Service Provider Trainings Housing/Landlord Navigator

- Stakeholders reported an increased need in mental health services to work in collaboration with homeless service providers
- Stakeholders reported a need for service provider trainings on topics such as active-shooter, de-escalation, and Diversity, Equity and Inclusion.
- Stakeholders reported challenges in finding available housing units, leading to a need for a Housing/Landlord navigator.

Tenant-Based Rental Assistance

\$360,000 (9% of total funding)

Populations Served:

Homeless; survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, and human trafficking

Recommendation:

Utilize funding towards security deposits for those entering rental assistance programs (i.e. CoC- or ESG-funded).

• Stakeholders reported that the lack of funding for security deposits is a barrier to connecting folks to housing opportunities



Non-Congregate Shelter

\$577,856
(15% of total funding)

Populations Served:

Homeless; survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, and human trafficking

Recommendation:

- Stakeholders reported a need for sheltering options for those who are resistant to entering congregate shelter settings and would benefit from ongoing support services.
- Stakeholders confirmed a need for non-congregate shelter in both cities of Schenectady and Troy. In Troy, it was recommended this be developed specifically for youth and families.


