Subject: Housing Inventory and Point-in-Time Count Summary

Memo Overview and Intention

This memorandum summarizes highlights from the 2023 Housing Inventory Chart (HIC) and Point-in-Time Count (PIT) compared to 2022 data.

2023 Housing Inventory Summary

Continuums are required to report annually on the number of available beds dedicated to homeless persons; these beds include emergency, safe havens, transitional and permanent housing. Below is a summary of changes within these beds from 2022 to 2023. Under each section, you will see a breakdown of the *primary* reasons contributing to changes.

Emergency Housing:

- *Emergency Year-Round Beds:* The number of emergency year-round beds remained the same at 17 in 2023.
- *Emergency Overflow Beds:* The number of overflow beds increased by 20, from 28 in 2022 to 48 in 2023.
 - Franklin County DSS increased utilization of hotel/motel beds by 20, from 25 in 2022 to 45 in 2023.
- *Emergency Seasonal Beds:* The number of seasonal beds remained the same at zero in 2023.
- Transitional Beds: The number of transitional beds remained at zero in 2023.
- Permanent Housing Beds:
 - Permanent Supportive Housing: Permanent supportive housing beds decreased by 4, from 26 in 2022 to 22 in 2023.
 - Veterans Administration- Albany VASH Franklin Essex VISN decreased by 4, from
 11 to 7 due to utilization.
 - *Rapid Rehousing*: The Rapid Rehousing bed count decreased by 71 beds, from 96 in 2022 to 27 in 2023.
 - In 2023 the Franklin County DSS NYS ESG-CV RRH program from 75 in 2022 to 3 in 2023 due to low funding and the program coming to a close.



- *Other Permanent Housing:* Other Permanent Housing (OPH) beds remained the same at 2 in 2023.
- *Chronic Beds*: The number of Dedicated Chronic beds remained the same at 2 in 2023.

NOTE: The decrease in Rapid Rehousing beds may negatively impact the community's CoC application score.

Sheltered PIT Breakdown

- When comparing the 2023 (60 persons) sheltered PIT with the 2022 (43 persons) sheltered PIT an increase in the total number of persons sheltered is noted.
- In total, there was an increase of 17 persons utilizing services on the night of the count with a 17-person increase in use of emergency services.

Sheltered PIT Subpopulation Information

- *Chronically Homeless Individuals:* The number of sheltered chronically homeless individuals remained the same at 1 in 2023.
- *Chronically Homeless Families*: The number of sheltered chronically homeless households remained the same at zero in 2023.
- *Chronically Homeless Vets*: The number of sheltered chronically homeless veterans decreased from 1 in 2022 to zero in 2023.
- *Chronically Homeless Youth:* The number of sheltered chronically homeless unaccompanied youth increased from zero in 2022 to 1 in 2023.
- *Adults with a Serious Mental Illness:* The number of sheltered persons with serious mental illness remained the same at 1 in 2023.
- *Adults with a Substance Use Disorder*: The number of sheltered persons with substance abuse disorders increased from 0 in 2022 to 2 in 2023.
- *Adults with HIV/AIDS:* The number of sheltered persons with HIV/AIDS remained the same at zero in 2023.
- *Victims of Domestic Violence*: The number of sheltered persons noting DV remained the same at 2 in 2023.



NOTE: Special populations (e.g., persons living with HIV/AIDS) often do not disclose their status which may indicate a lower than actual total number reported.

Unsheltered PIT breakdown

- When comparing the 2022 unsheltered PIT with the 2023 unsheltered PIT, a 3-person increase was noted.
- In 2022 there were zero unsheltered individuals identified compared to 3 in 2023.

- *Chronically Homeless Individuals*: The number of unsheltered chronically homeless individuals remained at zero in 2023.
- *Chronically Homeless Families*: The number of unsheltered chronically homeless families remained at zero in 2023.

- *Chronically Homeless Youth*: The number of unsheltered chronically homeless youth remained at zero in 2023.
- *Adults with a Serious Mental Illness*: The number of unsheltered persons noting a serious mental illness remained at zero in 2023.
- *Adults with a Substance Use Disorder*: The number of unsheltered persons noting a substance use disorder remained at zero in 2023.
- *Adults with HIV/AIDS*: The number of unsheltered persons noting HIV/AIDS remained at zero in
- *Victims of Domestic Violence*: The number of unsheltered persons noting DV remained at zero in 2023.
