## NEW PROJECTS

### **CARES of NY, Inc.**

#### **SNC CoC Planning Project**

**Project Description:** Corporation for AIDS Research, Education and Services, Inc. (CARES) requests funds to support the operations of the CoC. Proposed funds will support coordination and facilitation of the CoC's processes, including strengthening the current CoC system, assisting with the development and implementation of a coordinated assessment system, conducting project evaluation and monitoring, conducting annual Housing Inventory and Point-in-Time Count, participating in the Consolidated Plan, and preparing and submitting the CoC's application to HUD.

#### **Shelters of Saratoga Rapid Rehousing Project**

**Project Description:** Shelters of Saratoga requests funds to support their Rapid Rehousing project for 10 households (single homeless adults, 18+). The project aims to reduce homelessness by providing rental subsidies and voluntary supportive services, prioritizing those with severe needs. This proposal responds directly to the gaps in housing services within Saratoga County.

#### **Open Door Mission – HUD DV Project/Life Path Program**

**Project Description:** Open Door Mission requests funds to support their DV-centered project. The program requests funding for 6-bed, rapid rehousing for 12 guests during the year and an on-going community DV program, open to all women. The program will work with other homeless and DV service providers to provide support services to participants. This proposal responds directly to the need of domestic violence services in Saratoga County.

#### **CAPTAIN CHS – Coordinated Entry Expansion Project for SNC**

**Project Description:** CAPTAIN CHS requests funds to expand their current Coordinated Entry (CE) Program. CAPTAIN CHS has been designated as the CoC CE Lead for the Saratoga North Country Continuum of Care (SNC CoC). The need for this project was identified through discussions and planning of the entire SNC CoC Board, Strategic Plan Committee and Coordinated Entry Committee. This proposal responds directly to the need to expand CE services in SNC.

## RENEWAL PROJECTS

### **CAPTAIN Community Human Services, Inc.**

#### **Coordinating Entry for Saratoga-North Country CoC**

**Grant PIN:** NY1456

**Project Description:** CAPTAIN CHS requests continued funding to support a CE Coordinator position. This position will manage and administrate the CoC's CE system, oversee client services from program intake to program exit, monitor and facilitate data entry in the CoC's HMIS system, facilitate case conferencing, and manage the Coordinated Entry waitlist. Having a funded CE Coordinator will allow the SNCCoC to successfully meet the current and future HUD requirements for CE System in a planful, coordinated, and robust manner.

### **Catholic Charities of Saratoga, Warren, and Washington Counties**

#### **DVPWW Housing 2022**

**Grant PIN:** NY1455

**Program Description:** Catholic Charities of Saratoga, Warren, and Washington Counties requests continued funding to support the Rapid Rehousing program to assist 10 homeless domestic violence survivors secure and maintain stable permanent housing. Program participants will be provided advocacy and support as requested to establish and maintain permanent housing.

### **Domestic Violence and Rape Crisis Services of Saratoga County dba Wellspring**

#### **NewView - Rapid Rehousing I**

**Grant PIN:** NY0187

**Project Description:** Wellspring requests continued funding to support an RRH program in Saratoga County. This project provides housing and supportive services to individuals and families who are homeless due to domestic violence and who have a disability of mental illness, chemical dependency, or HIV/AIDS and are actively engaged in treatment. The project assists twelve households (in four one-bedroom, four three-bedroom, and four two-bedroom units) in scattered site apartments, to attain and maintain stable housing and to increase self-sufficiency so they may exit the program to violence-free, sustainable living.

#### **NewView Rapid Rehousing II**

**Grant PIN:** NY1221

**Project Description:** The proposed project will be a Rapid Rehousing project, with maximum 24-month subsidy. All Wellspring's services and programs are survivor centered, trauma informed and voluntary with a housing first orientation.

### **DV Coordinated Entry**

**Grant PIN:** NY1220

**Project Description:** The proposed project will be a Rapid Rehousing project, with maximum 24-month subsidy. All Wellspring's services and programs are survivor centered, trauma informed and voluntary with a housing first orientation. This project will specifically provide for 6 units to house a minimum of 8 domestic violence survivors.

### **NewView – Permanent Supportive**

**Grant PIN:** NY0184

**Project Description:** Wellspring requests continued funding to support a PSH program in Saratoga County. This project provides housing and supportive services to individuals and families who are homeless due to domestic violence and who have a disability of mental illness, chemical dependency, or HIV/AIDS and are actively engaged in treatment.

### **Veterans & Community Housing Coalition**

#### **Center Street Renewal**

**Grant PIN:** NY0188

**Project Description:** Saratoga County Rural Preservation Company requests continued funding to support a PSH program in Saratoga County. This project is designed to house homeless, disabled veterans and their families in permanent housing for a period of time leading to their ability to purchase a home of their own through an established savings program. The families are housed in a two-family home located in Ballston Spa, NY.

#### **SVAP Renewal**

**Grant PIN:** NY1038

**Project Description:** Saratoga County Rural Preservation Company requests continued funding to support a PSH program in Saratoga County. This project supports twenty one units of permanent supportive housing including four studio apartments, fourteen one-bedroom apartments, and three two-bedroom apartments. All fourteen units of permanent housing are dedicated to chronically homeless veterans with little or no income. The program adheres to the Housing First Model.

### **CARES of NY, Inc.**

#### **Warren, Washington, Hamilton, and Saratoga Counties Portion of the Capital Region HMIS**

**Grant PIN:** NY0189

**Project Description:** CARES of NY, Inc. requests continued funding to support a HMIS program for CoC NY-523. This is a data collection program which holds client level data. Participation in the

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Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) is a requirement for all recipients of CoC and Emergency Solutions Grant funds.

### **Adirondack Vets House, Inc.**

#### **AVH – Vets House PSH**

**Grant PIN:** NY1218

**Project Description:** Adirondack Vets House requests continued funding to support a permanent housing program in Northern Saratoga, Warren and Washington Counties. This project is a nine-bed co-ed permanent housing program for homeless veterans with disabilities located in Glens Falls, NY. The program assists veterans in all areas of their lives in order to help them make a transition into permanent housing while reducing or eliminating the barriers that have created homelessness.

### **RISE Housing and Support Services**

#### **RISE Housing First**

**Grant PIN:** NY1163

**Project Description:** RISE requests funds to support a permanent housing program to provide tenant-based rental assistance to 32 homeless households with disabilities in Saratoga County. These disabilities include mental illness, chronic substance abuse problems, and/or HIV/AIDS. In addition to receiving rental assistance, RAP participants are assisted in accessing supportive services within the community. The proposed project will operate under the Housing First Model.
