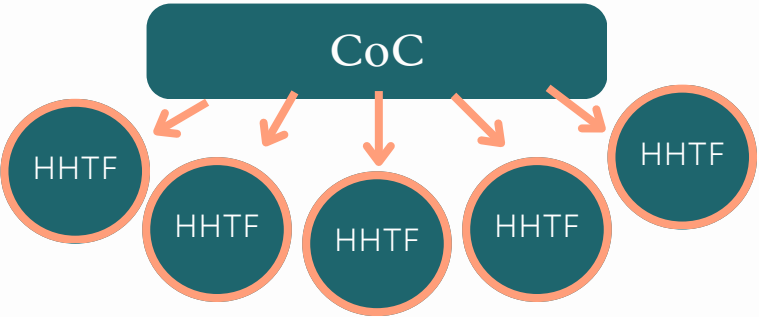

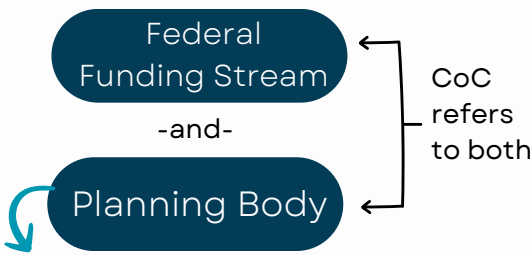


## Homeless & Housing Task Force



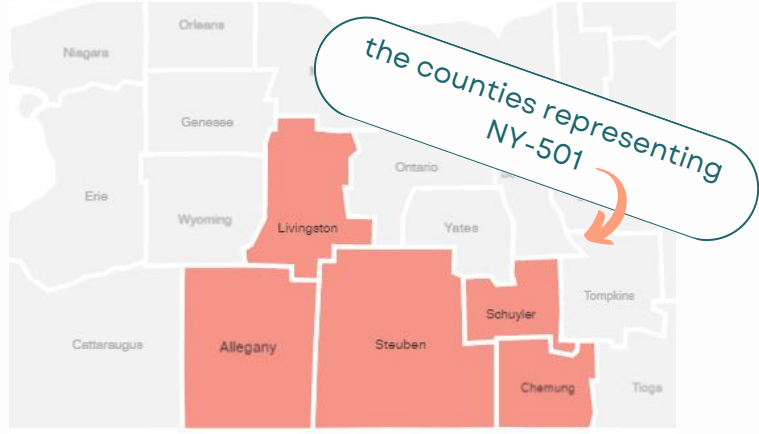
Each HHTF is considered to be the local functional arm of the Continuum of Care (CoC) and makes up the membership of the CoC. Each member of the HHTF is asked to complete a membership application. This allows the CoC to speak to a diverse set of stakeholders and program providers in the annual collaborative application to HUD.

## What is a Continuum of Care (CoC)?



The CoC Planning Body makes decisions about local CoC funding for homeless programs and coordinates services and housing designed to support the unhoused

The CoC is composed of a Board of Directors, Membership, The Systems Committee, The Rank and Review Committee, Coordinated Entry Committee and the Homeless Information Management (HMIS) Committee
