NEW PROJECTS

Capital Area Peer Services (CAPS)

Homeless & Peer Advocate Connection Transitions

This project will be a 9 bed, 18-24 month transitional residential housing program for chronically homeless women who live with mental illness. After an informal needs assessment of our drop-in center, CAPS has found that more services are available for homeless men than women. Women tend to be underrepresented. The need for a women's program, especially housing, is self-evident. Also, women with mental health diagnoses are especially vulnerable. There are limited housing options available for homeless women in the Capital region.

In Our Own Voices, Inc.

IOOV LGBTQ Housing Project

The proposed project aims to create a comprehensive transitional and rapid re-housing program specifically designed for LGBTQ+ individuals, with a particular focus on serving Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) communities. To achieve this, In Our Own Voices (IOOV) has acquired a building adjacent to its current location, which will be renovated and repurposed to expand its effective, evidence-based services. The renovated site will provide seven transitional housing units dedicated to LGBTQ+ youth, LGBTQ+ seniors, and Transgender adults, offering a safe and affirming environment for these vulnerable populations to stabilize and transition into more permanent housing.



Sheridan Ave Housing Project II provides four units of permanent supportive housing to homeless families in which the head of household is living with a disabling condition that has inhibited the family's ability to maintain housing. The Housing Case Manager is located onsite for Sheridan Hollow Housing I & II projects, and both Housing Case Managers meet regularly with each resident/head of household to provide intensive services focused on long-term housing retention,

stability, and overall self-sufficiency. Referrals are received through the Coordinated Entry system for each program.

MultiDivision Housing - IPH HATAS SCCC Collaborative

GRANT PIN: NY1033

Project Description: CARES has contracted with Interfaith Partnership for the Homeless who requests continued funding to support a PSH program in Albany County, NY. This project provides permanent supportive housing to six families (two per entity) and twenty-one singles (seven per entity). All households are chronically homeless and have a documented disabling condition. The program adheres to the Housing First model, accepting applicants regardless of income status, active or past substance use, criminal background, or history of domestic violence. In addition, participants are maintained in the program, regardless of their participation in supportive services, progress on their goal plan, improvement or maintenance of income, experience with domestic violence, or any other activity or behavior not outlined in their lease agreement.

IN OUR OWN VOICES, INC.

Transitional & Rapid Rehousing for LGBTGNC

GRANT PIN: NY1424

Project Description: In Our Own Voices (IOOV) requests funds to support a Transitional & Rapid Rehousing program. The proposed project will establish Albany's first Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender and Gender Non-Conforming (LGB TGNC) specific transitional/rapid re-housing services. IOOV is purchasing a new site to expand its effective, evidence-based programs for LGB TGNC individuals focusing on LGBT People of Color. The site will include 4 transitional housing units specifically for individuals who are LGB TGNC youth or Transgender individuals. The site will also host a new drop-in center for LGB TGNC youth to provide a safe and supportive space. By providing a range of services at one site, IOOV staff will establish trusted relationships with the homeless and at-risk individuals who will benefit from transitional housing.

JOSEPH'S HOUSE/HOMELESS ACTION COMMITTEE, INC.

JH- Kendall House

GRANT PIN: NY0037

Project Description: CARES has contracted with Joseph's House who requests continued funding to support a PSH program in Albany County, NY. Joseph's House operates 30 units of permanent SRO housing for people who had been living on the streets for years and who have alcohol dependence. The project has helped countless people get off the streets, have a home, and begin to make changes in their lives.

JH- Kendall House Expansion: Joseph's House is requesting to expand Kendal House supportive services to be able to better serve those who utilize their program, who typically have severe service needs.

LEGAL AID SOCIETY OF NORTHEASTERN NEW YORK (LASNNY)

Legal Aid - RRH for Families Expansion

GRANT PIN: NY1067

Project Description: CARES is requesting funding to support LASNNY's RRH project which will serve homeless families primarily sheltered by Albany County DSS at the Schuyler Inn & Marillac Family Shelter. 15 households will receive Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA). This project will expand/complement LASNNY's AC Solutions to End Homelessness Program (STEHP) RRH program and the existing CoC funded Legal Aid Rapid Rehousing for Families (LARFF) to serve motel & Marillac families. Funding will expand current capacity to provide TBRA & improved access to case management.

REHABILITATION SUPPORT SERVICES (RSS)

RSS Albany - SAIL

GRANT PIN: NY0052

Project Description: CARES has contracted with Rehabilitation Support Services who requests continued funding to support a PSH program in Albany County, NY. This is an eight-bed, scattered site, Permanent Supportive Housing Program for young adults ages 16-25 who are homeless and have a mental illness. This program provides daily contact and intensive supports in order to assist the participants with maintaining their housing and with utilizing community supports in order to increase their independence in the community.

ST. CATHERINE'S CENTER FOR CHILDREN (SCCC)

SCCC Supported Housing Plus

GRANT PIN: NY0570

Project Description: Individual Supported Housing and Supported Housing Plus are consolidating into one project. This PSH program serves 1) five chronically homeless singles, including youth under 25, and persons with substance abuse disorders, mental illness, and/or HIV/AIDS and a documented disabling condition, and 2) nine chronically homeless families (with an emphasis on large family units) most difficult to relocate from the emergency crisis system into permanent housing. The primary service offered is case management which emphasizes health (both physical and behavioral) and well-being of clients. The service also assists clients with the following: 1) Employment Readiness 2) Household management and skill development relative to landlord/tenant problem resolution 3) Identification of community resources (e.g., neighborhood associations, churches, schools) to support and assist these families and individuals, and to encourage the clients to experience themselves as contributing members of the community and 4) Inter-personal problem skill development emphasizing how to successfully live in diverse and complicated social environments.

ST. PETER'S ADDICTION RECOVERY CENTER (SPARC)

SPARC - S Plus C

GRANT PIN: NY0051

Project Description: CARES has contracted with St. Peters Addiction Recovery Center to request continued funding to support a Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) program in Albany County, NY. This program provides 27 housing vouchers to formerly homeless individuals and families with disabilities related to chronic substance abuse. The program is operated by St. Peter's Addiction Recovery Center, Inc. (SPARC). SPARC collaborates with Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Albany to provide rental assistance and case management for eligible participants.

CARES OF NY, INC./SUPPORT MINISTRIES, INC.

Support Ministries - Arvilla House

GRANT PIN: NY0034

Project Description: CARES has contracted with Support Ministries, Inc. who requests continued funding to support a PSH program in Albany County, NY. This project provides permanent housing and related services to homeless women living with HIV/AIDS.

Support Ministries - Project HELP

GRANT PIN: NY0046

Project Description: CARES has contracted with Support Ministries, Inc. who request continued funding to support a PSH program in Albany County, NY. Project HELP, which was previously transitional housing, is a permanent supportive housing program. The program provides permanent supportive housing and related services to three homeless individuals living with HIV/AIDS and three families of which one member is living with HIV/AIDS in a scattered site apartment program. Funding is used to rent the apartments, and for utility, insurance, supply and equipment costs. The additional funds cover the cost of a program manager and outreach staff.
