Shelters of Saratoga

Shelters of Saratoga RRH

Project Description: Shelters of Saratoga is proposing a new Rapid Rehousing project to assist seven qualifying households in the NY523 Saratoga-North Country COC with rent subsidy and support services to achieve stable housing. This project aims to swiftly end homelessness for individuals with the longest histories and most severe needs by providing rental assistance and care coordination for at least 12 months. The approach includes rental assistance and support services to promote housing stability and self-sufficiency by addressing chronic health issues, increasing income through employment or benefits, and teaching daily living skills.

Mechanicville Area Community Services Center

MACSC Rapid Rehousing Program

Project Description: MACSC will establish a rapid rehousing program within the greater Mechanicville community for victims of domestic violence and their children. MACSC will work directly with the owners of 3 newer apartment buildings within the Mechanicville School district to rent apartments that will be immediately available to homeless victims and their children. As a non-residential domestic violence advocacy program located within a family neighborhood resources center, MACSC has 27 years of experience administering dv programs. Currently, the number one issue keeping victims from leaving is lack of affordable housing. The MACSC Rapid Rehousing Program will directly supply safe transitional housing allowing victims independence and support while obtaining long-term housing.

Wellspring

Wellspring's NewView Housing

Housing Supportive Services-RRH

Project Description: Wellspring currently offers rent subsidized housing, intensive case management, and a financial education program, however, there is one area related to economic self-sufficiency that we wish (need!) to explore that could dramatically support survivors-- attaining a living wage to support their families. In order to escape abuse, domestic violence victims need sustainable employment so they can provide for their family's basic needs. the project will support working domestic violence survivors and parents by providing some basic needs assistance in moving into safe housing, maintaining that housing, and transitioning to independence. That support will include moving costs and also cleaning upon move-in, at transition out, and once annually to maintain the cleanliness of the rental units. Single working parents in particular struggle to stay on top of the myriad daily responsibilities in addition to work and parenting; this will alleviate those burdens while maintaining positive landlord relationships.

Project Description: CAPTAIN CHS requests additional funding to support a CE Coordinator position. 

This Transitional Living Program (TLP) project for Homeless Pregnant and Parenting Youth serves homeless youth ages sixteen to 21. The TLP is certified by the NYS Office of Children and Family Services to house up to five mothers and five infants for up to twelve months. The project provides case management, supportive services, and linkages to services to assist the residents in attaining a stable independent living situation in permanent housing and to be able to make healthy choices for themselves and their child. The project is located in Glens Falls, NY and serves youth from Warren, Washington and Saratoga Counties.

WAIT House Youth RRH

Grant PIN: NY1457

Project Description: WAIT House requests continued funding to support the RRH program that will provide rental assistance, case management and outreach to pregnant and parenting youths ages 16-24 and their dependents. The program will serve at least 7 youth-led families per year, approximately 7 units and 14 beds. The RRH program will primarily serve clients discharged from the existing TLP program, helping them to find and maintain permanent housing.

This program serves 5 households, and 19 individuals. These individuals access community services such as mental health treatment, substance abuse treatment, and employment assistance.
