Hudson River Housing notified the Steering Committee and the Collaborative Applicant, CARES of NY Inc. that the agency was voluntarily reallocating the funds from Hillcrest House Transitional Housing Project on September 24, 2024 the amount of the reallocation was \$141,619 to reprogram to another community high priority project. The CoC notified Hudson River Housing that their reallocation was accepted on October 4, 2024. Homebase Expansion

Project Description: Our new project will expand our existing PSH initiative, known as Home Base. Through this proposal, we will serve 12 additional (14 additional persons including 2 children, serving 6 dedicated chronically homeless) chronically homeless adults, most of whom we anticipate will be diagnosed with a serious mental illness. Other disabling conditions likely to affect our target population include chemical dependency, physical disabilities, or a combination of multiple disabling conditions. All potential residents will be referred through Coordinated Entry, with the majority having long-term and/or sporadic residency at the CoC's adult emergency shelter.
