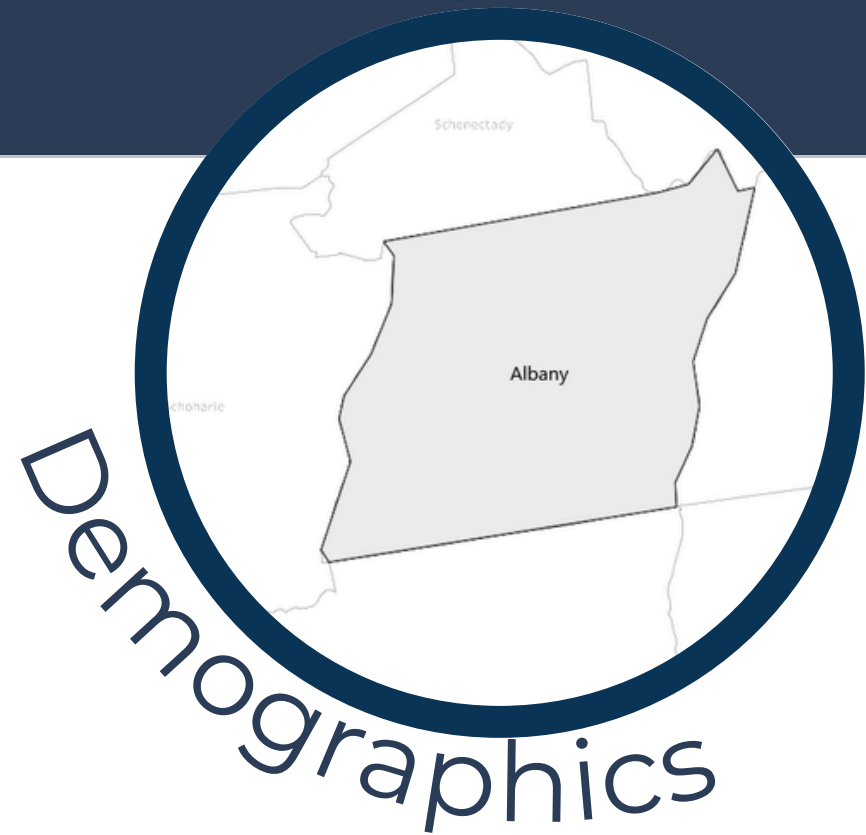

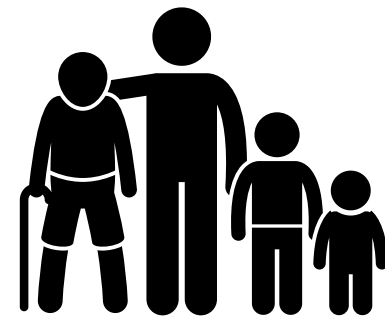

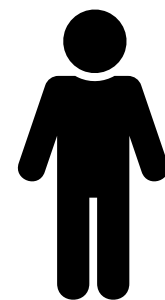

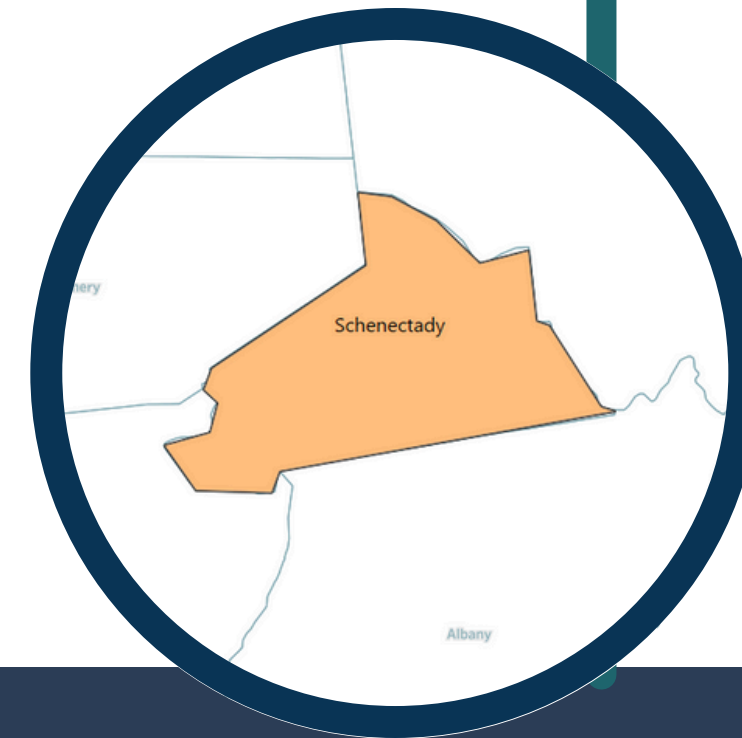

# Capital Region Total numbers on January 23, 2025

There were 1,647 people experiencing homelessness.  
(sheltered and unsheltered)

There were 1,422 people in CoC-funded housing.

The Average length of time households remained in  
emergency housing is 101 days regionally.

# Proposed Changes



## Cutting

Homelessness Assistance Grants (HAG) by **\$532 million**

➤ decreasing the programs by about 15%



Rental Assistance **Limited** to 24 months

➤ originally **permanently** affordable



**Consolidation** of CoC and HOPWA into ESG

*(ESG is an entitlement program operated by cities and states)*
